# MEDIA GUIDELINES & POLICIES

**To maintain a safe, professional, and well-coordinated working environment at BMO Stadium, we ask all credentialed media to review the following 2026 Media Guidelines. These standards are in place to support a smooth match-day experience.**

## GENERAL GUIDELINES

All credentialed media shooting or filming the match are required to wear a media bib at all times, which will be distributed at the credential desk, and must be worn for the entirety of the match.

Shooting or filming on the west sideline of BMO Stadium is strictly prohibited unless escorted by a PR Photo Marshal. This includes during pre-match Starting XI and any halftime or post-match on-field activities

Please **DO NOT** enter the Green Rooms on the Field Level. These are for ACFC staff only.

All credentialed media are expected to conduct themselves in a professional and respectful manner at all times. Harassment of any kind, use of foul or abusive language towards any ACFC staff, or behavior deemed inappropriate by club staff will not be tolerated and will result in immediate removal from the venue and revocation of credentials for the remainder of the season.

DO NOT take a photo of your credential and post it to the internet/social media, whether it is public or private.

Please DO NOT take photos with any players, ACFC investors, or celebrities attending the match. Failure to comply with this rule, will result in revocation of credentials.

**Failure to comply with these guidelines may result in immediate revocation of credentials for the current match and may lead to denial of future credential requests.**

## CREDENTIAL AND BIB PICK-UP

Media Check-in will open in Gold Lot adjacent to BMO Stadium two hours prior to kickoff. Please note, media will not be able to enter the stadium until that time, even with a season credential. Photo identification is required for credential pick-up.

Credential pick-up will close 30 minutes after kickoff.

Media members capturing photos or video **MUST** submit their ID at the credential tent to receive a bib, no exceptions. After the match, please return your bib to the Field Club Lobby desk (bottom of the Grand Lobby stairs) to retrieve your ID.

NOTE: If you anticipate arriving after the credential tent closes, please notify Alexyz Liggins at (951) 233-2202 in advance.

## MEDIA ENTRY

All media with valid credentials will enter BMO Stadium through the Media Entry gate, on the Southwest side of the Stadium, located to the left of the credential tent.

Press Box media will continue through the security tunnel to the service elevator, then continue up to the Sunset level (4th floor). Please do not use the elevators located in the Grand Lobby.

Photographers will continue through the security tunnel and turn left into the main concourse, where they will head to the elevator in the Northwest corner of the stadium. After taking the elevator down to the field level, photographers will walk through the North Hallway underneath the Supporter's Section towards the Northeast corner to their dedicated seat area. Please **DO NOT WALK ON OR ACROSS THE FIELD AT ANY TIME.**

A seating chart will be posted in the Northeast tunnel and will be strictly enforced. All photographers must stay within the designated area behind the video board.

**If you encounter any players en route to the photo section, do not stop for any photos or videos under any circumstances.**

## PRESS BOX GUIDELINES

Admittance is limited to working media members with credentials only. The Press Box is a working environment for writers, reporters, and match-day personnel. Cheering is not allowed in the press box.

Under no circumstances are photographers or videographers permitted to capture photo or video content from the Press Box. All video and photo capture must take place from the designated positions on the field level.

Seating charts will be posted throughout the Press Box. Media members must sit in their designated seats only. Abuse of the Press Box and media privileges will result in forfeiture of credentials.

Food and drinks will be provided to working media (press and photo) in the Press Box two hours before kickoff. The Press Box, located on the Sunset Level at BMO Stadium.

## PHOTOGRAPHER GUIDELINES

Photo positions will be assigned and posted in the tunnel leading out to the field. Stools will be labeled with name and outlet. Abuse of the photo work areas and media privileges will result in forfeiture of credentials.

Photographers may only shoot game action from their designated assigned seat and may not roam around arena to capture any content at any time unless approved to do so by PR staff.

Workspaces are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Field-level media are encouraged to set up their computers behind their shooting location, staying clear of the walkway.

Media are not permitted to sell their photos for their own monetary gain. Photographers must be shooting for a media outlet in order to cover the match.

## STARTING XI PHOTOS

### HOME STARTING XI

Photographers wishing to capture the home team Starting XI must line up in the Northwest tunnel behind the barricades after warmups have concluded. PR staff will escort approved media to the pitch for access.

### AWAY STARTING XI

Photographers wishing to capture the away team Starting XI must line up in the Southwest tunnel (video corner) of the stadium after warmups have concluded. PR staff will escort approved media to the pitch for access.

### ON-FIELD CONDUCT & ACCESS RULES

Once escorted to the field, media must remain behind the designated pitch line and outside of the technical box at all times, leaving clear space for players and coaches to walk to the bench.

Failure to follow positioning instructions or PR staff direction may result in removal from the area and/or credential revocation.

## VIDEOGRAPHER GUIDELINES

Videographers must only shoot footage from the southwest corner of the stadium on the field level. Video positions are assigned. Please note that you can only enter and exit the field video positions from the southwest corner. Please do not store your equipment in the tunnel walkway. You are only permitted to film the first 15 minutes of each half and cannot post clips of the match until the final whistle. All wireless microphones must be cleared by ACFC Staff before gameday.

## FAN/CROWD SHOTS

If you would like to enter the Supporter Section on the North End of the stadium to get crowd shots, you must speak with a PR staff member stationed on the field or in the Press Box. They will then notify an ACFC Community Team member in the North End who can meet you and escort you. Please do not enter the supporter section without notifying someone.

## LIVE SHOTS

## POST GAME PRESS CONFERENCE & MIXED ZONE

All credentialed media can access the Post-Game Press Conference located on the field level in the Interview Room beginning approximately 15 minutes after the final whistle. The press conference will feature the ACFC Head Coach in addition to up to 2 ACFC players.

If any media member requests to speak to an individual that is not in the Post-Game Press Conference, there will be a mixed zone opportunity by request that will operate concurrently to the press conference. Any request to speak to a player in the mixed zone must be submitted to the ACFC PR Team before the press conference begins.

**As players leave and/or linger around the stadium, under no circumstance are media members allowed to request any photos, videos, or interviews from them.**

# STADIUM & FACILITIES

## BMO STADIUM

3939 S FIGUEROA ST, LOS ANGELES, CA 90037

Angel City FC plays its home games at BMO Stadium, a 22,000-seat venue designed by global design firm Gensler that opened in 2018. Originally the home of MLS's Los Angeles Football Club, BMO is the first open-air stadium built in Los Angeles since Dodger Stadium in 1962.

The actual field at BMO is 86,000 square feet of natural Bermuda grass, a turf variety adapted for Southern California weather. The closest seats to the pitch at BMO are just 12 feet from the touchline, and every seat is within 135 feet of the field.

Located in Exposition Park, BMO Stadium anchors the south end of the Figueroa corridor and has views of the Downtown LA skyline. The venue is located near the convergence of the 10 and 110 freeways and easily accessible via the Metro Expo line.

## Fan Fest & Sol Rosa Rally

- Angel City hosts a Fan Fest or Sol Rosa before every home game, featuring sponsor activations, rotating food carts, and performances by local artists. The festivities are held north of the stadium's Northwest Plaza, near Christmas Tree Lane. When they are not hosting Fan Fest, you can expect a Sol Rosa Rally throughout the Concourse which also includes sponsor activations, spirit stations and much more.

## Box Office

The BMO Stadium Box Office is located at the northwest corner of the stadium and is open 2-6 p.m. every Tuesday. It opens at 10 a.m. on event days. Hours are extended to accommodate the needs of specific events. To purchase tickets, please visit [www.angelcity.com](http://www.angelcity.com).

## Training Ground

Angel City's training facility is at California Lutheran University. As a part of an ongoing partnership, ACFC provides internships to Cal Lutheran students, has staff members serve as guest lectures in sports classes, and hosts entrepreneurial workshops at the team's front office located in Santa Monica.


## ACFC PERFORMANCE CENTER

In January 2025, Angel City officially opened the Angel City FC Performance Center on the campus of California Lutheran University in Thousand Oaks, a state-of-the-art dedicated training ground purpose renovated for women athletes. The 50,000 complex is the largest dedicated practice facility in the NWSL.

### Features of the ACFC Performance Center include:

- **A 5,400-square-foot gym equipped with brand-new performance and sport science technology in addition to direct pitch access with roll-up doors**
- **Custom lockers for players, coaches, staff**
- **Dedicated locker room for players under 18**
- **New hydrotherapy area including cold and hot plunge pools and saunas**
- **A private outdoor relaxation lounge**
- **A 3,400-square-foot medical treatment and rehabilitation area, a private recovery room, private doctor's office and medical staff offices**
- **Elevated nutrition area for athletes to fuel with fresh, nutritious meals prepared onsite**
- **Children's playroom to support the families of our players and staff including a TV, toys, coloring books, and a private restroom**
- **Custom pre- and post-training nutrition and supplement area**
- **A 930-square-foot team meeting and film room**
- **Coaching and performance offices for soccer operations staff**
- **A fit-for-purpose studio onsite for content capture and interviews**
- **A custom boot wall with space for 90 pairs of cleats**
- **A dedicated press conference and media work room**



## MARK PARSONS

### Sporting Director

Mark Parsons has served as Sporting Director for Angel City since January 2025.

Parsons had a successful career as a coach in the NWSL and elsewhere before taking on the Sporting Director role. His NWSL experience began in 2013, when he was named head coach of the Washington Spirit mid-season. He led the group from a last-place finish in 2013 to two consecutive playoff appearances, including an appearance in the NWSL Final in 2015.

He was head coach of the Portland Thorns from 2016–2021, leading the team to five top-three finishes. Parsons helped the club acquire a long list of world-class players, including Sophia (Smith) Wilson, Sam Coffey, Lindsey (Horan) Heaps, Emily Sonnett, Ellie Carpenter, Amandine Henry, and Nadia Nadim, as well as up-and-coming players such as Olivia Moultrie, Yazmeen Ryan, and Morgan Weaver. Under his leadership, the team won two NWSL Shields, in 2016 and 2021, and a championship in 2017.

After leaving Portland, Parsons served as head coach for the Netherlands Women's National Team from 2021–2022. During his tenure, he guided the Dutch to the quarterfinals of the 2022 UEFA European Women's Championships.

He most recently had a second stint at the Spirit in 2023.



## MATT WADE

Angel City hired Matt Wade in September 2024.

He most recently served as head of sporting strategy at Feyenoord in the Netherlands, where he helped the club win three trophies in three seasons. # ALEX STRAUS

## HEAD COACH

Alex Straus was announced as Angel City's head coach in April 2025 and began his tenure in Jun 2025. He has accomplished significant milestones throughout his storied coaching career. He began at Varegg in 2010 while still playing, later becoming assistant coach at Nest-Sotra, where he helped secure promotion to Norway's First Division. From 2014–2017, he worked at Strømsgodset as an assistant coach and head of youth development before transitioning to women's football.

Straus made history by leading Sandviken to their first-ever Toppserien league title and a Norwegian Cup final in 2021. After Sandviken merged with SK Brann, he became the inaugural head coach of Brann Kvinner, where he led them to a second title before moving to FC Bayern Munich Women in July 2022. At Bayern, Straus continued his success, guiding the team to consecutive Frauen-Bundesliga championships in 2022/2023 and 2023/2024, as well as a Supercup der Frauen victory in 2024/2025.

Straus has also coached Norway's U-23 and U-19 women's teams, further showcasing his ability to develop talent at all levels. His philosophy of long-term growth, tactical innovation, and fostering resilience has made him one of football's most respected coaches.



## SAM LAITY

### Senior Assistant Coach

Sam Laity was hired as the interim head coach of Angel City FC in January 2025 before the hiring of Alex Straus.

Before coming to ACFC, Laity was most recently the head coach of the Houston Dash from 2022 to 2023. Before that, he was an assistant coach for the Seattle Reign for 10 years, starting in the NWSL's inaugural 2013 season. Laity helped coach the Reign to five playoff appearances, including two Shield wins, in 2014 and 2015. ## OLIVER BLITZ


### Performance Analyst

Hong holds a BS in athletic training from the University of Tampa, where she played varsity soccer. She is currently working towards an MBA at Cal State, Long Beach.





# ACFC TEAM HISTORY

Angel City Football Club's story began in July 2020, when founders Kara Nortman, Natalie Portman, and Julie Uhrman announced the creation of an NWSL expansion team that would take the field in 2022. From the start, ACFC set out to redefine what a professional sports franchise could look like: one built on purpose, equity, and impact both on and off the pitch.

The club's historic inaugural match took place on April 29, 2022, with a 2-1 win over the North Carolina Courage in front of a sold-out crowd of 22,000 at BMO Stadium. On the field, Angel City delivered a strong debut campaign, finishing eighth (of 12) with eight wins and 29 points, just four shy of playoff qualification. That season also featured two international friendlies: a 1-0 win over Liga MX Femenil powerhouse Tigres UANL, and a hard-fought 0-2 loss to the Mexico Women's National Team.

Angel City's sophomore season began unevenly, but a major turning point came in June 2023 when Becki Tweed was promoted from assistant coach to interim head coach. Under Tweed's leadership, the team surged, posting the league's best record in the second half and going undefeated until late September. ACFC clinched its first-ever playoff berth with a commanding 5-1 home victory over eventual Shield winners Portland Thorns FC, becoming only the third NWSL expansion team to reach the postseason within its first two seasons.

The 2024 campaign brought mixed results on the pitch but new milestones off it. ACFC's performance in the inaugural NWSL x Liga MX Femenil Summer Cup was a highlight, with the team going undefeated through the group stage before a narrow semifinal exit to NJ/NY Gotham FC. The midseason tournament also marked the remarkable return of forward Christen Press, who scored in her 100th NWSL appearance; her first goal in more than two years; cementing her place among the league's all-time top scorers. Another standout moment came in August, when Angel City recorded the biggest win in club history, a 7-0 victory over FC Juárez.

Beyond results, Angel City has set a new global standard for fan engagement in women's sports. In its inaugural season, the club sold out four matches and led the NWSL in attendance with an average of 18,534 fans. That momentum only grew: in 2024, ACFC once again sold out four home matches and averaged 19,313 per game, maintaining its place as one of the best-supported women's sports teams worldwide. The club's impact was further underscored in September 2024, when it was named the most valuable women's sports team in the world following a controlling ownership sale to Willow Bay, Dean of the USC Annenberg School for Communication and Journalism, and Bob Iger, then-CEO of Disney.

From the outset, ACFC has exemplified a new model of purpose-driven sports ownership. Through its groundbreaking 10% Sponsorship Model, each partner commits 10% of sponsorship funds directly to community organizations advancing causes such as sports equity, education, and food security. In 2024, the club expanded this vision with the launch of Angel City Impact, a community-powered fund developed in partnership with the City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks. The initiative provides low- and no-cost soccer opportunities for girls and gender-expansive youth across 104 sites in Los Angeles, reaching more than 15,000 young people each year.

Central to Angel City's identity is its vibrant supporter culture. The club's six official supporter groups—Mosaic 1781, Pandemonium, PodeRosas, Rebellion 99, Relentless Ladies, and Valkyries—bring unmatched passion and energy to every home match. Together, they create the electrifying heartbeat of La Fortaleza, the north-end safe-standing section at BMO Stadium, where drums, chants, and banners fuel the team through ninety minutes of relentless support.

From its trailblazing founders to its community-centric business model and record fanbase, Angel City FC has rewritten the playbook for what a professional sports team can be: a movement as much as a club, proving that purpose and performance can thrive side by side.

The slope of the shield's top line is 22° off the horizon. The horizon is our starting point, the place from where we will take flight. Valemest! The 22° angle represents the year of our team's inaugural season: 2022. Also, it honors the 22 players, representing both sides, needed to compete in the beautiful game.

**THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT**

Our angel is flying upward toward the sun, toward the moon... toward the light! The upper right corner of the shield represents the sunrises and moonbeams that guide our way. Our mission is to have a positive impact on the game and our community. We will always strive to be better, to soar higher, and to shine light on others.

**UNAPOLOGETIC OPTIMISM**

The pink-to-orange color gradient is reminiscent of the sunrises and sunsets, for which Los Angeles is famous. The colors symbolize the optimism our team will always have and from which we will never back down. We each pound our own piece of pavement, but at the end of every day, we all look west to the same sunset. And after the sun has gone, we know the sun will rise again tomorrow.



The crest's 22 degree angle, vertical axis, and horizontal axis intersect with circles that make up the shape of the emblem. This creates balance in the crest.



# JERSEY HISTORY & DETAILS





## FLARE KIT

A new look. Designed with edge, for the club and city that refuses to play it safe. Angel City FC is the contrast of glamor and grit, elegance and fire, light and dark. With a new kit that is poised for the runway, but raw enough for the pitch.

### OUR FIRST-EVER CENTER CREST

The new center crest layout is embraced by a pattern that draws the eye inward. A design that puts our club at the center, infused with Angel City DNA.

### METALLIC CREST

Our first ever special finish on a jersey, honoring our fifth season.

### FROM SOL TO SOUL

An art deco sunbeam pattern radiates from the heart, bursting out from our crest. A superhero moment for our club and city.

### SOL ROSA SHINES THROUGH

In a unified design move, DoorDash, NYX Professional Makeup, and Sprouts Farmers Market show up and show out for LA, all in sol rosa.



## LOS ANGELES KIT

The 2025 season will see the second, and final, year of the Moonlight jersey that places the wing from Angel City's crest in a gritty asphalt-like texture over a black background, a reference to the determination and resolve needed to conquer the path ahead.

The wings themselves recall the club's motto, *Volemos*, and remind us to keep flying in our fight for equity.

This season also kicks off the beginning of the club's new secondary kit, Los Angeles. The jersey pays homage to the culture and history of Los Angeles with an all-over pattern highlighting the city's most iconic landmarks. The toile-inspired design consists of a cream background repeating illustrations that honor modern and historic LA, allowing both local and global fans to find representation within the pattern.

### Historic Los Angeles landmarks represented in the intricate design include:

### In addition to honoring landmarks, symbolic designs incorporated in the pattern include:

- Boom box - honoring LA hip hop culture
- Palm trees - iconic to LA's landscape
- California poppy - California State Flower
- Birds of paradise - official flower of Los Angeles
- Tattoo-inspired text:
  - "Volemos"
  - "Los Angeles" / "LA"
  - "Angel City Football Club" / "ACFC"
  - 7.21.21 - The date that ACFC was announced as an expansion team in LA



## Moonlight & Sol Kit

The 2024 season kicks off with two all-new kits: the primary Moonlight jersey, and the sunrise-hued Sol secondary.

These two contrasting looks are in conversation with each other, each representing an aspect of the club that cannot exist without the other. Moonlight speaks to grit and determination, while Sol radiates joy and optimism.

Continuing with the home color palette established with ACFC's inaugural jerseys (see Jersey History below),

Moonlight places the wing from Angel City's crest in a gritty asphalt-like texture over a black background, a reference to the determination and resolve needed to conquer the path ahead. The wings themselves recall the club's motto, *Volemos*, and remind us to keep flying in our fight for equity.

The sunrise-toned gradient of the Sol jersey, meanwhile, sends the message that even after the darkest night, the sun will always rise another day.

# JERSEY HISTORY

Over their first two seasons on the field, Angel City players wore three different jerseys, each reflecting a chapter in the evolution of the club.

## DAWN AND DAYLIGHT

ACFC's two inaugural kits celebrated the club's birth, marking the beginning of a new era in LA sports and the NWSL. Each speaks to a different facet of the Angel City's identity; the home jersey, called Dawn, was inspired by the club itself, while the away jersey, Daylight, was in conversation with the city we call home.

With its black background and geometric sunrise pattern, Dawn evoked the moment just before sunrise when first light appears on the dark horizon. The Art Deco-style pattern is a nod to LA's historic architecture, while the zigzag configuration recalls that of the city's official flag. The club motto, *VOLEMOS*, appears on the nape of the neck, a reminder to always keep flying for greater heights together.

The away kit, Daylight, was a streetwear-inspired look drawing on LA's iconic palm trees to tell a story about the whole city, from the concrete to the coast. The club's signature shade of pink, Sol Rosa, evoked a sunrise, radiating warmth and optimism.



## REPRESENT

With Dawn carrying over into 2023, ACFC's second season brought a new away kit, the Represent jersey.

This jersey celebrated the multifaceted, ever-evolving nature of LA's urban landscape. The map design begins with the coastline and covers the greater Los Angeles area before fading out in a gradient—making clear that Angelenos aren't defined by borders. The half-tone design treatment breaks the image into tiny pieces, representing the multitude of cultures and identities found in the LA area. The "*VOLEMOS*" neck hit was designed by local artist Rachel Gomez, whose work is inspired by the Chicano culture she grew up in.

To further drive home its inclusive, expansive vision of LA, Represent also came with the option for fans to customize their jersey with one of 11 unique patches designed by artists, community leaders, and visionaries from across the region. Each patch represented a different facet of the city, from its music and food scenes, to the Black, Asian-American, and Indigenous communities that call it home.





# EXECUTIVE BIOS





## WILLOW BAY

A broadcast journalist, media pioneer, and digital communication leader, Willow Bay is a controlling owner of Angel City and the dean of the USC Annenberg School for Communication and Journalism, where she has advanced student-centered, industry-engaged curricula and programs, increased access to new technology and data solutions, and expanded scholarship support for the next generation of media innovators.

The first female dean of USC Annenberg, Bay oversees nearly 300 faculty and staff, and nearly 3,000 undergraduate and graduate students across the fields of communication, journalism, public relations and public diplomacy.

Prior to her role as dean, Bay spent three years as director of the Annenberg School (2014–17), guiding the launch of the state-of-the-art media center in Wallis Annenberg Hall, introducing the school’s new Bachelor of Arts in Journalism degree program and welcoming the first cohort of the school’s nine-month Master of Science in Journalism program.

Sports has also been an area of focus for Bay beginning with empowering athletes to tell their own stories on NBC’s “NBA Inside Stuff” and, most recently, helping to establish USC as the premier hub for the study and practice of sports journalism. In 2024, Bay and the “NBA Inside Stuff” team received the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame’s Curt Gowdy Transformative Media Award.

Bay also currently serves as vice chair of the Los Angeles County Museum of Art’s Board of Trustees as well as chair of the International Women’s Media Foundation’s Los Angeles Advisory Committee.



## BOB IGER

Bob Iger is a controlling owner of Angel City FC and the CEO of the Walt Disney Company.

At Disney, Iger has led a significant, enterprise-wide transformation, overseeing the acquisitions of Pixar (2006), Marvel (2009), Lucasfilm (2012), and 21st Century Fox (2019). He has also helped Disney embrace new platforms and technologies, including the launch of the Disney+ streaming service in November 2019.

During Iger's tenure, The Walt Disney Company has been recognized as one of the "Most Reputable Companies" in both America and the world by Forbes magazine (2006–2019); one of the "Best Employers" in both America and the world by Forbes magazine (2019 and 2018, respectively); one of the "World's Most Admired Companies" by Fortune magazine (2009–2021); and one of the "World's Most Respected Companies" by Barron's (2009–2017).

Previously, Iger was president and COO of ABC from 1994 until its acquisition by Disney in 1996. Iger was named president of Disney in 2000, transitioning to CEO in 2005. He retired from his position as CEO in 2020 before returning in 2022.

In 2023, Iger was featured on the cover of Time as part of its annual 100 Most Influential People issue. He was named Time's Businessperson of the Year in 2019 and one of Forbes magazine's "World's Most Powerful People" in 2018.

Iger was inducted into the Television Academy Hall of Fame in January 2020, and the Broadcasting and Cable Hall of Fame in 2015. He currently serves on the boards of the 9/11 Memorial & Museum and Bloomberg Philanthropies. From 2011–2019 he was a member of the Apple board of directors.



## NATALIE PORTMAN

Natalie Portman is an Angel City co-founder and an Academy Award-winning actress (*BLACK SWAN*, director, and activist). In Summer 2024, Portman made her television debut as 'Maddie Schwartz' in *LADY IN THE LAKE*, which aired on AppleTV+.

In 2021, Natalie and her producing partner, Sophie Mas, inked a first-look TV deal with Apple TV+ for their production company MountainA. MountainA produced the Golden Globe and Film Independent Spirit Awards-nominated dark comedy, *MAY DECEMBER*, directed by Todd Haynes, where Natalie stars opposite Julianne Moore. For this role, Natalie received a Golden Globe nomination for Best Actress—Musical or Comedy and a Film Independent Spirit Award for Best Lead Performance.

MountainA also produced the 2023 MAX docuseries *ANGEL CITY*, which follows the creation of the Angel City Football Club, a LA-based women's soccer team that Portman founded in 2020. Her other past production credits include the documentary *EATING ANIMALS*, which she executive produced and narrated. The film examines mankind's dietary choices and is based on Jonathan Safran Foer's memoir. Coming next, MountainA is set to produce the rainbow fantasy *ARCO* from French director Ugo Biennvenu, set in the futuristic world of year 2932. This project marks MountainA's first animated feature since its launch and is currently in the finalization process. MountainA is also co-producing the upcoming film *THE GALLERIST*, directed by Cathy Yan and starring Portman amongst an ensemble cast. *THE GALLERIST* follows a desperate gallerist who conspires to sell a dead guy at Art Basel Miami. The film is set to begin shooting later this year.

She was previously seen on the big screen with her return to the Marvel universe as 'Jane Foster' in *THOR: LOVE AND THUNDER*, as well as Pablo Larraín's film, *JACKIE*, in which she starred as First Lady Jacqueline F. Kennedy. For the role, Portman was nominated for an Academy Award, a Golden Globe, a Screen Actors Guild Award, a BAFTA Award, and won the Critics' Choice Award. She wrote, directed, produced, and starred in *A TALE OF LOVE AND DARKNESS*, which made its world premiere at the 2015 Cannes Film Festival and its North American premiere at the 2015 Toronto International Film Festival. Next up, Portman will be starring in the upcoming adventure epic *FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH*, directed by Guy Ritchie and set to release in mid-2025. The film also stars John Krasinski, Domhnall Gleeson, and Eiza González.

In Fall 2020, Portman released her debut picture book, *NATALIE PORTMAN'S FABLES*, which is a New York Times' Bestseller.

Portman is a Harvard graduate with a degree in psychology and studied at Hebrew University in Jerusalem.



## JULIE UHRMAN

Julie Uhrman is the CEO and Co-Founder of Angel City Football Club (ACFC), Los Angeles' professional women's soccer team co-founded by Uhrman, Natalie Portman and Kara Nortman. Under her leadership, ACFC is the world's most valuable women's professional football team, setting new standards for impact by reallocating 10% of all sponsorship back into the LAf community. She has received numerous accolades, including being named to the 2023 Gamechanger class by the Sports Business Journal, the Brand Genius Award by ADWEEK, Inc. Female Founders 250 List, and one of the 50 Most Inspirational Figures in Sport by Sports Illustrated.

Julie Uhrman, CEO and Co-Founder of Angel City Football Club (ACFC) in LA, founded the club alongside Natalie Portman and Kara Nortman in 2020. Under her leadership, ACFC is the world's most valuable women's pro football team, setting new standards for impact by reallocating 10% of all sponsorship back into the LA community and leading the league year over year in ticket sales, attendance and sponsorship revenue. She's received numerous accolades, including Brand Genius and Most Influential in Sports by Adweek, Inc. Female Founders 250 List, and one of the 50 Most Inspirational Figures in Sport by Sports Illustrated.



# KARA NORTMAN

Kara Nortman is a co-founder of Angel City and a managing partner at Monarch Collective, an investment platform dedicated to accelerating equity in global sport.

Prior to Monarch, Kara was a Managing Partner at Upfront Ventures, where she worked for eight years. Before joining Upfront, Kara spent close to seven years at IAC where she co-headed the M&A group and later served in operating capacities as the SVP and General Manager of Urbanspoon and Citysearch. She served on the board of IAC’s mobile technology incubator (Hatch Labs), where she incubated Tinder in their seed round. Earlier in her career Kara worked at Battery Ventures, Microsoft and Morgan Stanley.

Kara is also a founding member of All Raise, a VC-led Nonprofit dedicated to increased diversity in funders and founders, and she advised the Women’s National Soccer Team Players Association during their pay equity fight.

Kara holds an AB in politics from Princeton University and an MBA from Stanford University.

## Angel City Funding Model

Impact is a core part of Angel City Football Club's identity, and it's been built into the club's business model from the beginning. Through the pioneering ACFC 10% Sponsorship Model, 10% of each corporate partnership goes directly to support a community organization. Since 2021, ACFC has donated over \$4.8 million to the community via the club's sponsorship model.

## Impact Pillars

\* The central mission of ACFC's community impact is to drive towards equity to change the game both on and off the pitch. The club's approach is multigenerational and focuses on girls, women, and gender-expansive individuals. We partner with organizations working under our two impact pillars: essentials and education.





## **ESSENTIALS**

The Essentials pillar includes programs focused on opportunities to play and fundamental needs. Food security, community heritage and identity engagement, volunteerism, transportation, and soccer programs all fall under this category.

## **OPPORTUNITIES TO PLAY**

Girls Play Los Angeles (GPLA) and Football for Her are two of the play equity programs in ACFC's impact ecosystem.

Girls Play LA (GPLA), a program of the City of Los Angeles's Department of Recreation and Parks, provides low-cost sports leagues, camps, and clinics for girls and gender-expansive youth, with a focus on under-resourced communities. Program support includes recreational leagues at 104 sites and a leadership academy that targets high school-aged youth across five sites. Through collaborations with partners like BMO, youth are receiving sports-based youth development skills that will support them on and off the pitch.

Other programs under the play equity umbrella include camps and clinics throughout the LA area, as well as the Play with Pride Cup Tournament and Desert Pride Cup Tournament, which provide playing opportunities for adults from the LGBTQ+ community.





## FOOD SECURITY & ACCESS

Angel City and its partners support a range of food security programs. This includes partnerships with All Peoples Community Center and the Los Angeles LGBT Center on their food distribution initiatives in collaboration with DoorDash. To date over 2.6 million meals have been distributed.

## COMMUNITY HERITAGE AND LEARNING ENGAGEMENT

At Angel City, we consider every person's ability to be their authentic self just as essential as our other basic needs. That's why the celebration of diversity is woven throughout our impact ecosystem. We reflect the diversity of our city through the events and celebrations we support. Through volunteerism, we offer opportunities to connect our community through service.

## EDUCATION

\* The Education pillar includes personal development and professional development. Sports internship programs, community development workshops, and coach education all fall under this category.

## PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

ACFC supports programs aimed at developing career and leadership skills. The Artists in Residence program, led by the Las Fotos Project and sponsored by NYX Professional Makeup and Pasun, gives young photographers the opportunity to photograph Angel City home games throughout the season. Participants work with a mentor and get to showcase their work digitally and at in-person exhibitions.

The SOAR program, sponsored by Bandai Namco and Anthropologie, empowers young women and gender-expansive youth in the GPLA Leadership Academy program to build confidence, develop leadership skills, and explore future careers in sports. Through interactive workshops, mentorship, and hands-on experiences, participants grow as leaders both on and off the field.

STEM in Soccer bridges the exciting worlds of soccer and STEM to provide teenage girls and gender-expansive youth with the unique opportunity to learn about the technological advances transforming the sport. Through hands-on projects and access to subject matter experts from ACFC and Mindera Technologies, participants explore diverse STEM applications within a professional sports environment.

Garden School Foundation provides a Nutrition Education program sponsored by Sprouts Farmers Market that provides inclusive nutrition education to athletes in the GPLA Leadership Academy program. Through hands-on workshops, participants explore how food fuels their bodies and athletic performance while reflecting on culture, identity, and access.

The Twinning Project is a UK-based non-profit that pairs up—or “twins”—professional soccer teams with local prisons and jails to provide educational services to incarcerated people. In 2023, Angel City became the first professional women’s sports team to launch a women’s Twinning Project Program in the United States. This intervention program sponsored by Pasaadena City College aims to support character development and mental and physical health of incarcerated individuals through soccer and has partnered with LA County Sheriff’s Department and California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation.



## **PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT**

The Player 22 Program is dedicated to equipping retired professional women’s soccer players with the skills and resources necessary for success beyond their playing careers. The program provides funding, resources, and education to empower participants to excel in new industries and business ventures.

The ACFC Coach Network aims to build a pipeline for women and gender-expansive individuals to enter the coaching space. Through the California State Soccer Association–South (CalSouth), in partnership with Gatorade, Football Manager, and Yerba Madre, coaches receive opportunities for licensing, education, networking events, and access to paid coaching opportunities.

The Community Workshop Program provides free professional and skill-building workshops designed to support LA-based community organizations and their leaders. ACFC is committed to empowering local change-makers, who are often limited by funding, with the tools they need for strategic growth and impact. In partnership with Slaom and goodr the workshops foster a culture of resource-sharing and collaborative support to strengthen community organizations’ capacity for change-making.
