CREDENTIALS

- · Media members may apply for single-game matches, as well as season credentials by filling out the form online at thorns.com/media-resources/media-credentials. Credential applications must be submitted no later than 48 hours from match kickoff.
- The club will credential a limited number of non-rights media personnel, subject to the availability of media positions in the press seating areas, photographer, videographer and TV crew areas, as well as the photo workroom
- Applications from freelance writers, photographers or videographers must come from a direct supervisor validating professional and editorial need for media
- Media members may not use credentials for preferential access, such as autographs, photographs or personal requests. Violations will result in potential loss of credential for any future match.

PROFESSIONALISM

- · While on assignment at either training or match day, media is expected to dress professionally, meaning no jerseys or team representation of any kind.
- Failure to comply may result in loss of credential.
- Media members may not use credentials for preferential access, such as autographs, photographs or personal requests. Violation will result in immediate loss of credential for any future match.

MEDIA ENTRANCE

- All media personnel must enter the stadium through Gate G on matchday. (SW 20th Ave., along the west side of Providence Park), Gate G will open two hours prior to kickoff on matchday PRESS BOX.
- The press box is located above the seating bowl along the west side of the stadium. To get to the press box from the media entrance, enter the seating bowl from the concourse and take the stairs up through section 222 until you reach the gated walkway. The walkway leads directly to the press box. For media members needing elevator access, please use the suite elevator located on the northwest corner of the concourse.

PHOTO. VIDEO AND BROADCAST

- · Approved photographers, videographers and TV crews will be permitted to shoot the match from assigned positions. Media members may not shoot in the stands or on the concourse without prior approval from the PR team. Under no circumstance can media members sit in front of the field boards.
- There is no photo access behind the goals without prior approval from a member of the PR team and photographers and videographers are not allowed to shoot inside of the sixyard box.
- Media members are encouraged to stay on one endline during match play. Due to field seating, the east sideline is strictly off limits. Media are allowed to use the east sideline to pass from one end of the field to the other. The concrete area in the northeast corner near the photo work room is available for media to access when space is available during the run of play.
- Media members will only be allowed to cross the west sideline behind the benches during warm-ups, halftime or postgame when permitted by the PR team. The west sideline is off limits during the match for any non-club
- Due to limited space at Providence Park, photographers and videographers may only shoot from behind the field boards. Media should not utilize camera well platforms in the seating bowl to shoot the match without advanced approval from the communications staff. In addition, media are not permitted to shoot photos or video from the press box.
- Photographers, with the exception of club content staff and MLS Rights Holders, are not allowed on the pitch at any time, including warmups. At no point should photographers, videographers or TV crews enter the playing field, locker rooms, or other restricted areas proximate to players, coaches or club delegation members.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCES

- The home team post-game press conference will be conducted in the Media Conference Room (MCR) approximately 15 minutes after the final whistle.
- The MCR is located on the inside concourse on field level, near the northwest corner of the field. Media coming from the pressbox are advised to take the suite elevator to field level to access the MCR.
- Should you have a specific player request for postgame, please alert a member of the Thorns PR staff.

Portland Thorns FC, founded in 2012, wasted no time establishing itself as one of the most successful and trailblazing teams in the NWSL and professional women's sports. In their inaugural 2013 season, the Thorns made an immediate impact by winning the very first NWSL Championship, sending a clear message of the organization's intention to compete and make history. With a league-leading 3 NWSL Championships (2013, 2017, 2022), there is no denying the Thorns' dominance.

The Thorns have set high standards with their performances, consistently finishing in the top three all but two seasons of their 11-year history—a feat no other team in the league can claim. They've reached the playoffs in 10 of 11 regular seasons (2013-14, 2016-19, 2021-24), the most playoff appearances of any NWSL club. In addition to their championship successes, the Thorns claimed the 2016 and 2021 NWSL Shields, the 2020 Community Shield with the best record in the NWSL Fall Series, and the 2021 NWSL Challenge Cup. The club further solidified its status as a global powerhouse when they lifted the 2021 Women's International Champions Cup.

Names like Christine Sinclair, Tobin Heath, Lindsey Horan, Becky Sauerbrunn, Sophia Wilson, and Adrianna Franch are not just pivotal to the Thorns' success—they are legends of both the club and the league. These iconic figures have left an indelible mark on women's soccer, shaping the history of the Portland Thorns and the NWSL. Their remarkable skill, leadership, and impact on the game have made them global icons and some of the most recognizable names in women's soccer history.

Off the field, the Thorns have set the standard for fan engagement in women's sports. The club led the NWSL in attendance for 9 consecutive seasons from 2013 to 2021, culminating in a league-thenrecord 25,218 fans at Providence Park for a thrilling 2019 match against the North Carolina Courage. Not only that, but Portland became the first women's club in the world to average more than 10,000 fans per season starting in 2013, and then more than 20,000 fans per season in 2019.

As of 2024, under the new ownership of Alex Bhathal and Lisa Bhathal Merage, Portland is set to build on its rich history of success. With a legacy of 3 championships, 2 NWSL Shields, and an impressive international tournament record—including qualifying for the inaugural Concacaf W Champions Cup semifinals this May—the Thorns are positioned to continue breaking barriers and rewriting the history books in both domestic and global women's soccer.

The team crest was designed by artist and Timbers Army member Brent Diskin. Its design originally featured the team colors of red, black, and white "with a protective wreath of thorns surrounding a familiar, stylized rose in the center." The design also includes a pair of four-pointed stars, or hypocycloids, that house the letters "F" and "C" and anchor the sides of the badge, and resemble the star prominent on Portland's official city flag.

From 2018 onward, the team's primary crest was reduced from four to two colors, typically either with a red or black background and red or white features. The team completed its transition to a two- or one-color crest in 2019, when it revealed new secondary kits that discarded the four-color crest. The original design would not reappear in the team's identity until March 2023, with a "Heritage" designation as part of new secondary kits.



PROVIDENCE DE LA COMPANION DE



Providence Park is the home stadium of Portland Thorns FC, located in the Goose Hollow neighborhood of Portland, Oregon. As the the oldest soccer-specific stadium in American professional soccer, it has a rich history, dating back to 1893. Originally known as Multnomah Stadium, it has undergone multiple renovations and name changes, with its current name resulting from a partnership with Providence Health & Services in 2014.

The stadium underwent significant upgrades in 2011 to accommodate professional soccer matches and in 2019, further expansion raised the seating capacity to 25,218 to enhance the fan experience. The Thorns FC began playing at Providence Park in 2013, and the stadium continues to host their home matches.

The facility includes modern amenities, including premium seating, multiple video boards, and an expanded East End with three additional seating decks. Providence Park remains a soccer-centric venue, known for its consistent sell-outs, offering a fan-friendly environment in the heart of the city for both the Thorns and Timbers.

Providence Park continues to serve as an essential asset for Portland, becoming one of the most iconic grounds in the country and serving as the heart of the Portland Thorns community.



THORIS TRANS FACILITY



RAJ Sports, the sports investment platform for the Bhathal Family, owners and operators of Portland Thorns FC and the new Portland WNBA franchise, announced plans in February 2025 for a first-of-its-kind dual sport women's performance center, serving both a women's professional soccer (NWSL) and a women's professional basketball (WNBA) team.

Designed as a facility that champions innovation and athletic excellence, the performance center will feature a first of its kind elite training core, elevating the standard of athletic development by integrating cutting-edge training, advanced recovery, and holistic wellness with lifestyle elements specific to the needs of female athletes in a collaborative multi-team setting.

The 12-acre performance center will feature the following:

- · 63,000-square-foot training facility
- · 17,000-square-foot practice gym, featuring two full size basketball courts
- · Two full-sized soccer pitches with an outdoor training zone
- $\cdot\,$ A 5,000 square-foot, dynamic strength training facility featuring top of the line equipment, an outdoor turf zone and a yoga/pilates room
- · Elite training core program, integrating strength and conditioning, sports science, and sports medicine
- \cdot Dedicated dressing rooms for the WNBA and NWSL teams with amenities designed for the female athlete in a spa like setting
- \cdot Dining room with a full-time chef and nutritionist, offering performance-focused meals and refueling stations throughout the facility
- · Dedicated rooms for player's families
- · Team meeting rooms and social media content rooms
- · Private player parking and player entry for convenience and security







Jeff Agoos was named President and General Manager of Soccer Operations for Portland Thorns FC on January 7, 2025. A legendary figure in American soccer, Agoos brings unparalleled expertise and an extensive track record of success to his leadership role with the Thorns.

Agoos is one of the most accomplished players in Major League Soccer (MLS) history, with a career that spanned more than a decade at the highest levels of the game. As a standout defender for the U.S. Men's National Team, Agoos earned 134 caps and represented his country in three FIFA World Cups—1994, 1998, and 2002. His defensive prowess and leadership on the international stage were integral to the success of the U.S. during his tenure, and he remains a central figure in the country's soccer history.

A key contributor to the dominance of MLS in its early years, Agoos played for two of the league's most successful franchises—D.C. United and the San Jose Earthquakes. During his career, he amassed five MLS Cup championships, the most by any player in league history. His time with D.C. United saw him win MLS titles in 1996, 1997, and 1999, while his later years with San Jose were highlighted by additional titles in 2001 and 2003, cementing his place as one of the league's most decorated players. In recognition of his extraordinary career, Agoos was inducted into the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2009.

Following his retirement from playing in 2005, Agoos transitioned to executive leadership, where he has continued to shape the landscape of American soccer. He served as Technical Director for the New York Red Bulls, a role in which he was responsible for overseeing player development, team operations, and strategic direction. Most recently, Agoos held the position of Senior Vice President of Competition, Operations, and Medical at Major League Soccer. In this capacity, he played a pivotal role in the league's growth, overseeing key areas such as competition integrity, operations, and player welfare, all while enhancing MLS's global standing.





Mike Norris was named Technical Director of Portland Thorns FC after serving as the team's fifth head coach. In his new role, Norris will focus on scouting, talent acquisition, and player development. As head coach, he posted a record of 10-7-8 in 25 NWSL matches.

Before joining the Thorns, Norris spent eight years with Canada Soccer, where he served as the set play and goalkeeper coach for the Canada Women's National Team from 2019 to 2021. During that time, Canada won a gold medal at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics.

Born in Ashington and raised in Newcastle upon Tyne, Norris brings a wealth of experience in soccer both internationally and domestically to his role with the Thorns.



Rob Gale was appointed Head Coach of Portland Thorns FC in July 2024.

Gale joined the Thorns in March 2023 as an assistant coach under Mike Norris. He became the first Zambian-born individual to coach an NWSL team and win a league match.

Before his time with Portland, Gale built a strong coaching background at both the youth and professional levels. He began as a youth coach in NYCFC's academy system before becoming head coach and general manager of Valour FC in the Canadian Premier League. Additionally, he worked as a youth coach for Canada's national team programs, contributing to the development of emerging players.





VYTAUTAS (VYTAS) ANDRIUSKEVICIUS ASSISTANT COACH

Vytautas Andriuškevičius, commonly known as Vytas, joined Portland Thorns FC as an assistant coach in May 2022. A former professional footballer who played as a left-back, Andriuškevičius had a successful playing career in Europe and MLS. He began his career in Lithuania with FBK Kaunas before playing for clubs such as Lechia Gdańsk (Poland), Djurgårdens IF (Sweden), SC Cambuur (Netherlands), and the Portland Timbers (MLS).

Andriuškevičius also had stints with D.C. United, FK Sūduva (Lithuania), FC Tobol, and FC Kyzylzhar (Kazakhstan) before retiring in 2021. He earned several caps with the Lithuania national team during his playing career. As an assistant coach for the Thorns, Andriuškevičius brings a wealth of experience in professional soccer and player development to the coaching staff.



SARAH LOWDON ASSISTANT COACH

Sarah Lowdon joined Portland Thorns FC as an assistant coach in 2024, bringing extensive NWSL coaching experience to the team. A native of Newcastle, England, Lowdon previously served as the interim head coach of the Houston Dash in both 2022 and 2023, leading the team to a 6-6-3 record and a club-record six-game unbeaten run in 2022. Under her leadership, Houston reached the playoffs for the first time in club history, finishing in fourth place.

Lowdon is the youngest female to ever earn the U.S. Soccer Pro License, the highest coaching credential in the United States. She has also coached at various collegiate programs, including Penn State, Sam Houston State, the University of Florida, Wayland Baptist University, and McNeese State University.



Jordan Felgate joined Portland Thorns FC as Goalkeeper Coach in March 2025. Most recently, Felgate served as the U18 Goalkeeper Coach for the Wales national team. Prior to that, he was Head of Academy Coaching at Norwich City, starting in October 2022. Felgate brings a wealth of experience from his five seasons at Blackburn Rovers, as well as roles with the academies of Bolton Wanderers, Manchester City, Manchester United, and Stockport County's first team and youth goalkeepers.
