GENERAL GUIDELINES

There will be no shooting or filming on the west sideline, unless you are escorted by a photo marshal. Please do not enter the Green Rooms on the Field Level, these are for ACFC staff only. Media members shooting or filming the game will be asked to wear a media bib for the entirety of the match that will be distributed at the credential desk.

PHOTOGRAPHER GUIDELINES

The Photographer Work Area is located next to the photo locations on the Field Level in the Northeast tunnel. Photographers may only shoot game action from their designated seat (they will be marked).

VIDEOGRAPHER GUIDELINES

Videographers can shoot footage from the southeast corner of the stadium on the Field Level.

Video positions are not assigned. Please note that you can only enter and exit the field video positions from the southeast corner. Please do not store your equipment in the tunnel. You are permitted to film the first 15 minutes of each half and cannot post clips of the match until the final whistle. Any wireless microphones must be cleared by ACFC Staff prior to gameday.

FAN/CROWD SHOTS

If you would like to enter the Supporter Section on the North End of the stadium to get crowd shots, you must speak with a PR staff member stationed on the field or in the Press Box. They will then notify an ACFC Community Team member in the North End who can meet you and escort you. Please do not enter the supporter section without notifying someone.



STADIUM & FACILITIES

BMO STADIUM

3939 S FIGUEROA ST, LOS ANGELES, CA 90037

Angel City FC plays its home games at BMO Stadium, a 22,000-seat venue designed by global design firm Gensler that opened in 2018.

Originally the home of MLS's Los Angeles Football Club, BMO is the first open-air stadium built in Los Angeles since Dodger Stadium in 1962.

The actual field at BMO is 86,000 square feet of natural Bermuda grass, a turf variety adapted for Southern California weather.

The closest seats to the pitch at BMO are just 12 feet from the touchline, and every feet is within 135 feet of the field.

Located in Exposition Park, BMO Stadium anchors the south end of the Figueroa corridor and has views of the Downtown LA skyline.

The venue is located near the convergence of the 10 and 110 freeways and easily accessible via the Metro Expo line.

STREET FAIR & FAN FEST

Angel City hosts a Street Fair or Fan Fest before every home game, featuring sponsor activations, rotating food carts, and performances by local artists. The festivities are held north of the stadium's Northwest Plaza, near Christmas Tree Lane.

BOX OFFICE

The BMO Stadium Box Office is located at the northwest corner of the stadium and is open 2-6 p.m. every Tuesday. It opens at 10 a.m. on event days. Hours are extended to accommodate the needs of specific events. To purchase tickets, please visit www.angelcity.com.

TRAINING GROUND

Angel City's training facility is at California Lutheran University. As a part of an ongoing partnership, ACFC provides internships to Cal Lutheran students, has staff members serve as guest lectures in sports classes, and hosts entrepreneurial workshops at the team's front office located in Santa Monica.



Angela Hucles Mangano was named General Manager in August, 2022, after spending her first months with the club as Vice President of Player Development and Operations.

Hucles Mangano is a retired US Women's National Team (USWNT) player, two-time Olympic gold medalist, and Angel City founding investor. In her critical role as GM, Hucles Mangano oversees the sporting vision of the club, coaching, the first team, player care, medical and performance, sports science, soccer operations, and all wellness programs and resources.

A longtime member of the USWNT, Hucles Mangano's international career included 109 caps and two Olympic gold medals. In 2009, Hucles was named the U.S. Soccer Foundation Humanitarian of the Year. She played college soccer at the University of Virginia, where she was a four-year all-ACC player and tallied 59 goals, including a record 19 game-winners.

She is still Virginia's record holder in career goals, game-winning goals, and total points.

Off the pitch, Hucles Mangano ran a successful real estate group with her wife, Meg Mangano. She has commentated on LAFC games and worked as the lead women's soccer analyst for ESPN's ACC Network, NBC Olympics Olympics (2012–2021), and FOX Soccer Women's World Cups (2015–2021). In 2015, she served as the president of the Women's Sports Foundation.

Outside of ACFC, the Virginia Beach, Virginia native, enjoys spending everyday adventures with her family, including her two children.



Becki Tweed joined Angel City as an assistant coach early in 2023. After being named interim head coach in June, 2023, Tweed led Angel City to the best record in the NWSL over the second half of the season, posting six wins and just one loss, and the club's first-ever playoff appearance. She was officially named Head Coach in November 2023.

Previously a member of Gotham FC's coaching staff from June 2020 until December 2022, Tweed has a combined 12 years of coaching experience in the US at every level—youth development academies, Division I college, professional, and international. With Gotham FC, Tweed helped lead the team to the 2021 Challenge Cup Final, the 2021 NWSL playoffs, and the 2020 Challenge Cup semifinals. Tweed served as acting head coach in a 0–0 draw against Chicago on September 4, 2021.

The native of Bristol, England was also co-head coach of the Gotham FC Reserves team that won the 2021 WPSL championship. The team included five players now on NWSL rosters. For her efforts, Tweed was honored as WPSL Coach of the Year.

In 2022, Tweed served as an assistant coach for the United States in the FIFA women's U-20 World Cup in Costa Rica and when the US team won the championship of the Sud Ladies Cup in France. In addition to her work with Gotham FC and for US Soccer, Tweed has spent several years developing players throughout the New Jersey area. Before joining Gotham FC, she coached multiple teams within the girls' academy at STA in Morristown. Tweed also worked as an assistant coach for Monmouth University's women's soccer program, helping guide the team to a conference championship.

OLIVER BLITZ


Performance Analyst



Angel City Football Club's story begins in July 2020, when founders Kara Nortman, Natalie Portman, and Julie Uhrman launched the club as an NWSL expansion team and announced it would be taking the field in 2022. The team's inaugural game took place on April 29, 2022, a 3–1 win against the North Carolina Courage in front of a sold-out crowd of 22,000.

On the field, ACFC surpassed all previous expansion teams in 2022 with an eighth-place (out of 12) finish, winning eight games and earning 29 points—landing just four points out of playoff position. The team also played two friendlies that year, one against Liga MX Femenil side Tigres UANL, a 1-0 win, and one against the Mexico Women's National Team, which ended in a 0-2 loss.

Angel City's sophomore season got off to a rocky start, prompting the club to elevatebring on Becki Tweed from assistant coach to as interim head coach. Following Tweed's hiring in June, exactly halfway through the regular season, the team earned the best record in the league, going undefeated until the third-to-last game of the year. The club earned its first-ever playoff appearance after closing out the season with a thrilling 5-1 home victory against the league-leading Portland Thorns.


They went on to suffer a disappointing 2-0 loss on the road to OL Reign, but history had already been made, as Angel City became just the third expansion team to make the playoffs within their first two seasons (see "2024 in Review" for more details).

Since its inception, ACFC has been a standard-bearer for attendance not just in the NWSL, but in women's sports globally. The team sold out four home games in 2022 and averaged a league-leading 18,534 fans during the regular season. 2023 saw five sellout crowds and an average attendance of 19,361.

ACFC prides itself on being not just a world-class soccer club, but a force for good in the community, with a first-of-its-kind business model that builds impact into the structure of the organization. Under Angel City's 10% Model, each sponsor contributes 10% of its total sponsorship money to a community partner, whose work ranges from sports equity to education to food security (see Community Impact on page XX).

The unparalleled atmosphere at Angel City home games is thanks not just to the club's attendance numbers, but also its six grassroots supporter groups: Mosaic 1781, Pandemonium, PodeRosas, Rebellion 99, Relentless Ladies, and Valkyries. During home games, the members of these groups—consisting of the most die-hard Angel City supporters—fill La Fortaleza, the safe-standing section in BMO Stadium's north end. Supporters spend the 90 minutes of each game chanting, waving flags, and urging ACFC to victory to the beat of a drum section.

2024 JERSEY

The 2024 season kicks off with two all-new kits: the primary Moonlight jersey, and the sunrise-hued Sol secondary.

These two contrasting looks are in conversation with each other, each representing an aspect of the club that cannot exist without the other. Moonlight speaks to grit and determination, while Sol radiates joy and optimism.

Continuing with the home color palette established with ACFC's inaugural jerseys (see Jersey History below), Moonlight places the wing from Angel City's crest in a gritty asphalt-like texture over a black background, a reference to the determination and resolve needed to conquer the path ahead. The wings themselves recall the club's motto, Volemos, and remind us to keep flying in our fight for equity.

The sunrise-toned gradient of the Sol jersey, meanwhile, sends the message that even after the darkest night, the sun will always rise another day.

JERSEY HISTORY

Over their first two seasons on the field, Angel City players wore three different jerseys, each reflecting a chapter in the evolution of the club.

2022: DAWN AND DAYLIGHT

ACFC's two inaugural kits celebrated the club's birth, marking the beginning of a new era in LA sports and the NWSL. Each speaks to a different facet of the Angel City's identity; the home jersey, called Dawn, was inspired by the club itself, while the away jersey, Daylight, was in conversation with the city we call home.

With its black background and geometric sunrise pattern,
Dawn evoked the moment just before sunrise when first light
appears on the dark horizon. The Art Deco-style pattern is a
nod to LA's historic architecture, while the zigzag configuration
recalls that of the city's official flag. The club motto,
VOLEMOS, appears on the nape of the neck, a reminder to
always keep flying for greater heights together.

The away kit, Daylight, was a streetwear-inspired look drawing on LA's iconic palm trees to tell a story about the whole city, from the concrete to the coast. The club's signature shade of pink, Sol Rosa, evokeds a sunrise, radiating warmth and optimism.



2023: REPRESENT

With Dawn carrying over into 2023, ACFC's second season brought a new away kit, the Represent jersey.

This jersey celebrated the multifaceted, ever-evolving nature of LA's urban landscape. The map design begins with the coastline and covers the greater Los Angeles area before fading out in a gradient—making clear that Angelenos aren't defined by borders. The half-tone design treatment breaks the image into tiny pieces, representing the multitude of cultures and identities found in the LA area. The "VOLEMOS" neck hit was designed by local artist Rachel Gomez, whose work is inspired by the Chicano culture she grew up in.

To further drive home it's inclusive, expansive vision of LA, Represent also came with the option for fans to customize their jersey with one of 11 unique patches designed by artists, community leaders, and visionaries from across the region. Each patch represented a different facet of the city, from its music and food scenes, to the Black, Asian-American, and Indigenous communities that call it home.







2023 IN REVIEW

Angel City begins 2024 on the heels of a historic sophomore season that saw the club earn the best record in the NWSL over the second half of the season, a run of form that enabled ACFC to reach the playoffs for the first time in their history.

The team began 2023 with a number of new signings, starting with the NWSL Draft in January. Angel City used their No. 1 overall pick to select Los Angeles native Alyssa Thompson, a highly touted 18-year-old who had already earned two caps with the senior US Women's National Team. Thompson would make an immediate impact for ACFC, scoring just 11 minutes into her regular-season debut in the team's home opener against Gotham FC. The club also selected goalkeeper Angelina Anderson and midfielder MacKenzie Pluck in the draft.

Other new signings in 2023 included Mexican internationals Katie Johnson and Scarlett Camberos, French international Amandine Henry, and two-time NWSL champion Elizabeth Eddy. Also noteworthy was the return of defender Sarah Gorden, who had suffered a season-ending injury before the 2022 season and was available to play for the first time in 2023.

On the field, 2023 got off to a rocky start, with Angel City earning a 2-3-6 (W-L-D) record over their first 11 games, including a 0-2 loss at home to rival San Diego Wave FC. Following a five-game winless streak between May 13 and June 10, the club parted ways with Head Coach Freya Coombe, appointing then-assistant Becki Tweed as interim manager.

In their first game under Tweed, the team stole three points back from San Diego on the road in a 2-1 win. The result marked the start of an eight-game regular-season undefeated streak (the team also got results in all three of their remaining games in the UKG Challenge Cup). Defensively, ACFC conceded just eight goals in that run while scoring 17. In terms of both points and goal differential, Angel City was the best team in the league during that period.

A tight table—even by the hyper-competitive standards of the NWSL—meant the playoff race came down to the last game of the season for multiple teams, including Angel City. The team faced a daunting test in that match against the top-ranked Portland Thorns—which they passed with flying colors, earning a 5–1 rout, their highest-scoring game and biggest win of all time. The win punched ACFC's ticket to the 2023 playoffs, sending them to Seattle to play fourth-place OL Reign.

Although Angel City was eliminated after a disappointing 0-2 loss to the Reign, 2023 still marked a major milestone in club history. Following the team's remarkable run of form over the back half of the season, Tweed was named full-time head coach in November.





Natalie Portman is an Angel City co-founder and an Academy Award-winning actress, director, and activist.

Portman's recent film credits include May December, Vox Lux, Lucy in the Sky, and Thor: Love and Thunder. She wrote, directed, produced, and starred in A Tale of Love and Darkness, which made its world premiere at the 2015 Cannes Film Festival and its North American premiere at the 2015 Toronto International Film Festival. Portman also executive produced and narrated the documentary Eating Animals.

In addition to her film work, Portman devotes time to several humanitarian causes. She is an ambassador for WE, an organization that empowers youth to remove barriers that prevent them from being active local and global citizens. Portman is also a founding member of Time's Up, a campaign led by women in the entertainment industry working to ensure equality and safety in the workplace for people of all genders.

A Harvard graduate with a degree in psychology, Portman has studied at Hebrew University in Jerusalem.



Julie Uhrman is the president and a co-founder of Angel City Football Club.

Uhrman was named a member of the 2023 Sports Business Journal (SBJ) Game Changer class. She was listed as one of the Ten Influencers of 2023 by SportsPro Media, one of the Most Influential People in Sports Business 2022 by the SBJ, one of the 100 Most Creative People in Business by Fast Company, and was named to the Creative 50 list by Ad Age.

Julie is active in the LA sports and technology communities. She is a board member of the LA Sports and Entertainment Council, the Rose Bowl Institute, and the LA Sports Council, as well as an active executive in the LA Chapter of WISE (Women in Sports and Events).

Before ACFC, Uhrman was the EVP and General Manager of OTT Ventures at Lionsgate, Head of Platform Business Development at Jaunt, and founder of OUYA, a pioneering Android-based game console.



KARA NORTMAN

Kara Nortman is a co-founder of Angel City and a managing partner at Monarch Collective, an investment platform dedicated to accelerating equity in global sport.

Prior to Monarch, Kara was a Managing Partner at Upfront Ventures, where she worked for eight years. Before joining Upfront, Kara spent close to seven years at IAC where she co-headed the M&A group and later served in operating capacities as the SVP and General Manager of Urbanspoon and Citysearch. She served on the board of IAC's mobile technology incubator (Hatch Labs), where she incubated Tinder in their seed round.

Earlier in her career Kara worked at Battery Ventures, Microsoft and Morgan Stanley.

Kara is also a founding member of All Raise, a VC-led Nonprofit dedicated to increased diversity in funders and founders, and she advised the Women's National Soccer Team Players Association during their pay equity fight.

Kara holds an AB in politics from Princeton University and an MBA from Stanford University.















THE 10% SPONSORSHIP MODEL

Impact is a core part of Angel City's identity, and it's built into the club's business model. Through the pioneering ACFC 10% Sponsorship Model, 10% of each partnership goes directly to a community partner to support programming. In 2023, Angel City partners donated \$1.3 million to the LA community via the club's impact model.

IMPACT PILLARS

The central mission of ACFC's impact initiatives is to leverage sport and entertainment to drive towards equity, with sports equity as a particular area of focus. The club's approach is multigenerational and focuses on girls, women, and gender-expansive individuals. To accomplish that mission, we partner with organizations working in our two impact pillars: essentials and education.





ESSENTIALS

The Essentials pillar includes programs focused on both basic needs and access to play. Food security, transportation, no-cost soccer, and sports equipment distribution all fall under this category, with corporate partners including DoorDash, Cedars-Sinai, Chevrolet, and BMO.

PLAY EQUITY

Girls Play Los Angeles (GPLA) and Football for Her are the marquee play equity programs in ACFC's impact ecosystem.

GPLA, a program of the City of Los Angeles's Department of Recreation and Parks, provides free sports leagues & clinics for girls and nonbinary youth, with a focus on underserved communities. Through collaborations with partners such as BMO, high school students are getting leadership development, in addition to sports skill development, alongside their teammates.

Football for Her is a nonprofit founded by Shawna Palmer, a former NWSL player who runs free clinics and free-play events for girls & gender-expansive kids, supported by ACFC and Cedars-Sinai. Their Footy Friday events, which take place every week in Pacoima and Gardena, provide participants with free coaching and rotating educational workshops led by Palmer and often featuring Angel City players—but the heart of Footy Friday is the small-sided pickup games that give players space to play freely & expressively in a supportive environment.





FOOD SECURITY & ACCESS

Angel City and its partners support a range of food security programs. The club partners with All People's Community Center and the Los Angeles LGBT Center on their grocery distribution initiatives as part of their partnership with DoorDash. ACFC also co-hosts volunteers at the Garden School Foundation's free farmers markets as part of the partnership with Sprouts Farmers Market, utilizing the 10% from the sponsorship.

Goals that Give is an in-stadium activation with front-of-kit sponsor DoorDash that allocates a donation of 1,000 meals to All Peoples Community Center for each goal scored by an Angel City player.

DIVERSITY, EQUITY, INCLUSIVITY, & BELONGING (DEIB)

Ensuring we make an impact across the entire LA community is a major focus of ACFC's community work, and DEIB is woven throughout our impact ecosystem. Both the organizations we support—including All People's Community Center, the Los Angeles LGBT Center, and Las Fotos Project, just to name a few—and the communities they work with reflect the beautiful diversity of our city.





EDUCATION

The education pillar focuses on leadership and professional development. Mentorship and internship programs, scholarships, financial literacy initiatives, and coach and career training programs are among the specific areas supported by this pillar. Birdies, Sprouts Farmer's Market, PNC Bank, and PayScale all support community partners working in education.

LEADERSHIP

ACFC has two initiatives aimed at developing career and leadership skills in youth of color.

The Artists in Residence program, led by Las Fotos Project, gives a small group of young photographers the opportunity to photograph Angel City home games throughout a season. Participants work with an adult mentor and get to showcase their work at in-person exhibitions & digitally.

The SOAR Mentorship program, sponsored by Birdies, is a six-week paid internship where young women and nonbinary teens of color shadow an Angel City front office departmentof their choice. Participants also hear from successful female professionals from Angel City, Birdies, and beyond, and collaborate on projects designed to build professional skills, leadership ability, & confidence.
