BAY FC BECOMES A REALITY - EXPANSION ANNOUNCEMENT

On April 4, 2023, the National Women's Soccer League announced it awarded expansion rights for team #14 to an investment group representing the Bay Area, California, which would begin play in 2024. Co-founded by four U.S. Women's National Team legends—Brandi Chastain, Aly Wagner, Danielle Slaton, and Leslie Osborne—in partnership with global investment firm Sixth Street, Bay FC is changing the face of women's soccer as we know it.



Bay FC is a team that defies convention and transcends culture. We are proud to represent the Bay Area with its tapestry of different ethnicities, languages, climates, and ideas. Our team will be a uniting force, building a culture of belonging and shared pride. We will become a beacon of hope and connection, welcoming and embracing all fans. Our stadium will be a home for people of all backgrounds and identities. We will be the bridge that unites the Bay's diverse communities. Through our actions and our love of the game, we will inspire and improve the lives of others.

While our community is our foundation, our love of football is our reason for being. We have the fire to be the best, and we will show up on the field every day with intensity, competitiveness, passion, and a drive to win.

THE CREST

Bay FC is represented by a logo steeped in tradition, yet modern and unapologetically athletic: an iconic "B" mark that fuses bridge iconography with classic gothic typography. The logo represents the Bay Area's unique culture and style, drawing inspiration from the iconic Golden Gate Bridge and the Bay's impressive street art scene. The bottom and top serifs also nod to the fog that blankets much of the region.

"Bridges define the Bay Area and are symbols of strength that connect us all. Bay FC will unite the region's tapestry of different cultures, languages and ideas with shared pride and a sense of belonging," said Danielle Slaton, co-founder of Bay FC. "Our team will be bold and authentic, while humbly serving something greater than ourselves."

In the team logo, the bold "B" is further brought to life with a refreshing palette of team colors—dark navy blue, warm poppy red and fog gray—a striking combination that stands out and is inspired by the natural beauty of the Bay Area. Both the name and branding offer a strong and classic style with representation of the community it strives to unify. Bay FC co-founders worked closely with renowned San Francisco-based advertising agency Goodby Silverstein & Partners (GS&P) to create the club's brand and visual identity.

"Street art and street style are central to the soul of the Bay Area and were a big inspiration for this brand," said Benny Gold, legendary local streetwear designer and design director at GS&P. "We designed a logo that people from all over the Bay, and far beyond, would be proud to wear and represent Bay FC."

Aly Wagner is a co-founder of Bay FC and serves as co-chair and alternative governor of the board of directors.

A two-time FIFA Women's World Cup bronze medalist, 2002 MAC Hermann Trophy winner and two-time Olympic gold medalist, Aly is FOX Sports' lead match analyst for the FIFA Women's World Cup. In 2022, she became executive producer for Groundwork with Aly Wagner, the first NWSL shoulder content providing fans with behind-the-scenes coverage of NWSL players.

Aly played at Santa Clara University, winning a national championship in 2001 with Bay FC co-founders Leslie Osborne and Danielle Slaton. She played for the USWNT from 1999 to 2008 and was on the U.S. 2003 and 2007 World Cup squads, as well as the 2004 and 2008 Olympic teams. Aly was selected as the number-one pick at the WUSA Draft in 2003 by the San Diego Spirit. She also played for the Boston Breakers, Olympique Lyonnais and Los Angeles Sol. Aly resides in the Bay Area with her husband and their four children.

DANIELLE SLATON svp, strategic projects and head of foundation





Danielle Slaton is a co-founder of Bay FC and a former USWNT player who has served as a match analyst for AppleTV, Fox Sports, NBC, and ESPN.

Danielle played for the USWNT from 2000-2005, earning a silver medal at the 2000 Olympic Games and a bronze at the 2003 FIFA Women's World Cup. She played professionally in the WUSA, winning a championship with the Carolina Courage and was named league defender of the year in 2002. She went to Santa Clara University, where, alongside Bay FC co-founders Leslie Osborne and Aly Wagner, she captained her team to an NCAA championship in 2001.

Danielle serves on the board of directors for the U.S. Soccer Federation and the U.S. Soccer Foundation. She is chairwoman of the board for the Bay Area Women's Sports Initiative and is a certified Positive Coaching Alliance trainer who travels on behalf of the State Department to coach kids about the life lessons found in soccer. Danielle lives in the Bay Area with her husband and two young sons.



BRANDI CHASTAIN





Brandi Chastain is a co-founder of Bay FC and an iconic sporting figure. She was inducted into the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2016 and the Bay Area Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.

Brandi helped bring women's soccer to the masses during the 1999 Women's World Cup finals when she scored a legendary penalty-kick goal and then struck her now infamous pose. She's won two FIFA Women's World Cups, two Olympic Golds, one Olympic Silver and the WUSA Championship. Brandi played at Santa Clara University, winning the Honda Sports Award as the nation's top female soccer player.

Over the past 30 years, she has held various coaching positions across the Bay Area at both the youth and collegiate levels and holds a U.S. Soccer A License. In 2004, she became a commentator and analyst for NBC during the 2008 and 2012 Summer Olympics. Brandi founded Bay Area Women's Sports Initiative, a nonprofit helping underserved girls learn leadership skills through sports. She lives in the Bay Area with her husband.

LESLIE OSBORNE





Leslie Osborne is a co-founder of Bay FC and a decorated former member of the USWNT. She has been a member of the FOX Sports broadcast team covering the FIFA Women's World Cup since 2015 and serves as a studio analyst for FOX's Soccer Tonight. Leslie has worked with CBS/Paramount + and Just Women's Sports covering the NWSL.

Leslie made her first USWNT appearance in 2004 and played in the 2007 FIFA Women's World Cup, where the U.S. took third place. She played professionally for nine seasons, serving as team captain on all of her WPS and NWSL teams. Leslie played at Santa Clara University, where she received the Honda Sports Award as

the nation's top female athlete in soccer and won a National Championship.

Leslie is also co-founder of Hustle Beauty. Leslie and her husband, Ricky Lewis, live in the Bay Area with their three daughters.

Alan Waxman serves on the board of Bay FC and is a co-founding partner and CEO of Sixth Street. Founded in 2009, Sixth Street manages approximately \$65 billion in assets with over 500 team members, including more than 180 investment professionals around the world. Alan helped spearhead Sixth Street's investment in Bay FC, a record-breaking institutional investment in women's professional sports. Previously, Alan was a Partner at Goldman Sachs and Chief Investment Officer of its largest proprietary investing business. At Goldman, Alan founded and led private capital investing franchises in growth capital solutions, direct lending, and alternative energy infrastructure, among others. Alan is Chairman of the board of directors for Legends and serves on the board of overseers for the University of Pennsylvania

College of Arts and Sciences. He is a Board Member Emeritus for Tipping Point Community and serves on the advisory council for the Boys and Girls Club of the Peninsula.

PAYPAL PARK

On July 21, 2023, Bay FC announced it would call PayPal Park its initial home stadium when the team plays its inaugural season in the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) in 2024. Bay FC will be investing more than \$3M in a world-class, 3,600-square-foot standalone facility adjacent to the stadium that will house the team's locker room, office areas, lounges, training rooms, hydrotherapy facilities and other accommodations. It will also serve as the team's central home for game-day operations. Fans will experience an entirely customized Bay FC game day experience with the support of PayPal Park and highly engaged sponsors and partners.



ABOUT PAYPAL PARK

The stadium is just west of the San Jose airport and has a capacity of approximately 18,000.
Features a canopy roof and the largest outdoor bar in North America, a 2-acre fan zone and a double-sided video scoreboard.

• PayPal Park has been home to the San Jose Earthquakes of Major League Soccer (MLS) since it opened in 2015.

PayPal Park has hosted five sellout matches for the U.S. Women's National Team (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2023), including a packed house on July 9 for the U.S. vs Wales 2023 World Cup send-off match. • PayPal Park has played host to clubs from all over the world since its opening in 2015, including Manchester United, CD Guadalajara, Club America, Arsenal F.C. and the U.S. Men's National Team

Lucy Rushton is the General Manager of Bay FC, an elite football franchise and the 14th expansion team of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL). The 2024 season marks her first season at the helm with the club

Rushton leads Bay FC's player recruiting and development efforts as the club builds a soccer culture centered on providing its players with the resources and opportunities to reach their highest potential. She brings to Bay FC a passion for providing in-depth, high-quality feedback to coaches, directors and owners.

A football analyst and scout by trade, Rushton has a deep history of on-pitch success. She was most recently the GM for Major League Soccer (MLS) team D.C. United. Prior to D.C. United, Rushton was head of technical recruitment and analysis for Atlanta United FC, where she helped that team claim the 2018 MLS Cup.

She also held the position of Senior Performance Analyst at Reading Football Club, where she helped the club secure promotion to the English Premier League (EPL) after a first-place finish in the 2011-2012 Championship.

Rushton is a graduate of the University of Reading, England.









MATT POTTER TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Matt Potter is in his first season as technical director for Bay FC.

He will work closely with General Manager Lucy Rushton and Head Coach Albertin Montoya to provide expert support across all areas of soccer operations with a strong focus on scouting and player development. In his role, Potter will help establish practices and processes inside the department, while also working on broader club projects and initiatives.

Potters comes to Bay FC after serving as the head coach of the Kansas City Current (2022-23). During his tenure, he guided the Current to the NWSL Championship game in 2022.

Prior to his time with Kansas City, Potter was an assistant coach with the U.S. Women's National Team and the head coach for the U.S. U-23 Women's National Team. He served as a scout for the USWNT during the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup, while also gaining experience as a scout for the U.S. coaches at tournaments in Asia and Europe on the senior and youth levels.

Before working with U.S. Soccer, Potter was a head coach at Washington State (2003-11) and the University of Oklahoma (2011-19).

A native of Mere, England, Potter holds a USSF Pro license, USSF Talent Scout license and United Soccer Coaches Premier License.







ALBERTIN MONTOYA

Albertin Montoya was named as the club's first head coach on Sept. 27, 2023. The 2024 campaign will mark his first season with the club and his first as an NWSL head coach.

Montoya most recently served as the interim head coach for the NWSL's Washington Spirit in 2022.

His Bay Area ties run deep, having coached and played in the region throughout his youth, collegiate, and professional career. He served as head coach of FC Gold Pride as part of the Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) League from 2009 to 2010—leading the team to a championship season in 2010—and co-head coach of California Storm as part of the Women's Premier Soccer League (WPSL) from 1999 to 2006. As the head coach of the U17 U.S. Women's National Team, he led the team to the Concacaf Championship in 2012.

In addition to his professional coaching career, Montoya founded Montoya Soccer Academy (MSA), an elite youth soccer program based in Los Altos, Calif., that has developed some of the Bay Area's top youth soccer talent and coached at the Mountain View Los Altos (MVLA) Soccer Club.

He also played collegiately at Santa Clara University and was a first-round draft pick in the MLS for the San Jose Clash, now known as the San Jose Earthquakes, in 1998.

Montoya has been recognized as the Soccer America Women's Coach of the Year and FIFA Women's World Coach of the Year finalist in 2010. He holds a USSF "A" License.



JASON GOODSON Assistant coach





The 2024 season marks Goodson's first season with the club.

He comes to Bay FC with more than 12 years of college experience as a recruiting coordinator at Washington State University, Ohio State University and the University of Kentucky.

Goodson was most recently the director of coaching with Reno MVLA Soccer Club. A native of San Jose, Calif., Goodson's coaching career started in 1996 with the Leahi (Hawai'i) Soccer Club, followed by various coaching positions in Hawaii, including the director of coaching at the Ho'okalakupua Futbol Academy from

1999-2005.

He holds an A license from the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) and a premier diploma from the United Soccer Coaches.

ANGELA SALEM Assistant coach



Salem begins her first season with the club in 2024.

Prior to her joining Bay FC, Salem served as an assistant coach with the Washington Spirit during the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

Salem played professionally for 12 years in the United States, including nine seasons in the NWSL, along with stints in Australia and Finland. She retired at the end of the 2021 season, earning NWSL Best XI honors as a midfielder and was an MVP finalist with Portland Thorns FC.

A native of Akron, Ohio, Salem has a USSF B license and a Master of Education in counseling from Springfield College (Mass.) where she was a graduate assistant working with the women's soccer program.

DIEGO RESTREPO Head of goalkeeping





Restrepo is in his first season as the head of goalkeeping for Bay FC. He spent the last two seasons with D.C. United in MLS.

Prior to his coaching career, Restrepo was a goalkeeper both in the U.S. and South America, playing in the first division in Colombia and Venezuela. Domestically, he gained experience with United Soccer League (USL) sides Austin Bold, San Antonio FC and Charlottle Independence as well as with the Tampa Bay Rowdies and Ft. Lauderdale Strikers in the Northern American Soccer League (NASL). He made more than 100 professional starts and was named USL Goalkeeper of the Year and USL Best Eleven in 2017.

Hardin brings over a decade of elite sports experience to Bay FC, most recently with Major League Soccer's (MLS) Minnesota United FC, serving as the league's first female senior director of player health and performance.

During her time with the Loons, she held various roles, including head athletic trainer, senior director of player health and performance and player health and performance consultant for the team. Hardin will be tasked with ensuring Bay FC players receive top-notch care on and off the field.



Club announces that the team will play their inaugural season at PayPal Park - the home of Major League Soccer's (MLS) San Jose Earthquakes, making it their home venue.

SEPT. 27, 2023

Selects Bay Area local and former Santa Clara player and coach Albertin Montoya as the club's first head coach.

NOV. 14, 2023

Unveiled plans for San Jose State University to serve as the team's training facility for their inaugural season.

NOV. 15, 2023

Acquires first player in a trade with Kansas City Current, bringing Santa Clara graduate and midfielder Alex Loera to the club.

NOV. 21, 2023

Makes first free agent signing, brining veteran NWSL defender Caprice Dydasco to the club.

DEC. 12, 2023

Announces football operations hires: Technical Director Matt Potter, Medical Director Stacey Hardin, Performance Director Maximilian Lankheit, Scouting Director Austin Buchanan, Football Operations Director Andrew Loomis and Data and Analytics Director Arielle Dror as first football operations staff.

DEC. 13, 2023

Reveals historic partnership with Sutter Health as club's first founding partner, front-of-kit partner and official medical provider.

DEC. 14, 2023

Announces coaching staff ahead of the 2024 season, adding Jason Goodson and Angela Salem as assistant coaches and Diego Restrepo as the head of goalkeeping to complete technical staff.

Club signed first ever NWSL draft pick - No. 2 overall in the 2024 NWSL Draft Savy King to a contract through 2026 season.

FEB. 21, 2024

Played first preseason match against San Diego Wave FC as part of the Coachella Valley Invitational in Indio, Calif. Maya Doms tallied the club's first preseason goal.

TRAINING FACILITY DIRECTIONS/PARKING For media arriving for pre-training interviews:

Please park in the lot on 7th St. (1291 S 7th St., San Jose, 95112) across the street from the Simpkins Stadium Center. Parking is approximately \$3.00 and can be paid for by using the machines in the lot. Media area asked to please gather outside the team's facility near the grass area on the west side of the building. Staff will escort the media to the field after interviews. We politely ask that the media remain outside the building. Please text Katie Simons (720-207-8167) upon arrival.

For media arriving for training portion only (b-roll and photos):

Parking is available closer to the field in the parking ramp **(1200 S. Tenth St., San Jose, 95112)** directly across the street from the team's practice field. Parking is approximately \$3.00 and can be paid for by using the machines in the structure. When you arrive at the stadium, please wait near the fence at the corner next to the metal bleachers for Bay FC Communications staff to arrive and provide further instructions about designated approved areas for photographers and television cameras to shoot during the session. **Please text Katie Simons (720-207-8167) upon arrival.**

The head coach and requested player swill be made available to media on designated days, as noted by the team's weekly training calendar.

During the season, interviews with select players will take place between approximately 10-10:30 a.m. (Pacific) prior to training just outside the team building.

Interviews with the head coach will begin at approximately 11 a.m. (Pacific) before the start of training.

For sit-down or feature interview requests, please coordinate with Bay FC Communications staff to make arrangements as time is limited before training sessions.

The team will also host weekly matchday -2 or matchday -1 (schedule permitting) Zoom availabilites, which will be included on the weekly schedule. A recording will be shared with media.

MEDIA GUIDELINES - MATCHDAY

PARKING

Media members should park in Parking Structure 2 (PS2). Turn from Coleman Ave. onto Earthquakes Way and make a right onto Wondo Way. PS2 will be the second parking structure on the right. Please tell the attendant you have a pass in PS2 before they scan. A pass should be sent to you ahead of matchday. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Katie Simons at ksimons@bayfc. com.

CREDENTIAL PICK UP

Media should pick up their credential from the Media Will Call window at the Ticket Office located near the main gate of the stadium. If you have not received prior written approval for a credential, a media credential will not be granted for that day. Media Will Call opens two hours prior to kickoff and will close 30 minutes prior to kickoff. If you plan to arrive later or earlier, please make arrangements with Bay FC communications staff to gain entry to the stadium.

STADIUM ENTRANCE

After passing through bag check, media members should enter PayPal Park through the main gate of the stadium. Please do not use any other gate to enter. Gates open two hours prior to kickoff.

ACCESS TO PRESS LEVEL

There are two routes to get to the press level: 1) walk up the stairs in section 101 or 2) take the elevator near the player bridge. Please note, no access is being given to the 'breezeway' between the stadium and Front Office building prior to the match, so please only enter the elevator from the stadium concourse.

ACCESS TO PRESS BOX

Once on the press level, media should turn right from the elevator. The press box is the sixth door on the right. Press box workspace is reserved for members of the Bay FC Communications staff and written media with an assigned seat.

Press Box Restrooms: The nearest restrooms are located at the North and South sides of the upper concourse behind the press box and broadcast booths of the stadium. Media may also access the restrooms in the concourse areas.

PHOTO WORK AREA/FILING

Photographers may use the tent designated behind the scoreboard in the far-left corner as a photo work area before the match, at halftime and post-match. Seating, power and Wi-Fi are available inside the space. If photographers need to file photos from the field, please contact the Bay FC staff 24 hours prior to the match to make arrangements.

PHOTOGRAPHER & ENG/TV NEWS CREW INFO

Photographers are allowed to shoot from either the North or South end lines, behind the field boards or inside the painted boxes on the field. No photographers can shoot next to the Referee Review Areas (RRAs) where video replay checks are done by referees. You also cannot cross through those areas during the match. Movement is not allowed along the sidelines except prior to the game, halftime and after the game. Sideline access is only allowed on the bench side of the field for shooting the pregame walkouts, coin toss and team photos. Media members are not allowed on the field of play at any time, including pre-game and post-game.

Photo marshals and stadium security will be present on field to assist any photographers with questions or other needs.

Access to Photo Locations: Photographers can access the north side, closer to the bar, from the Northwest ramp near the main gate. Photographers can access the south side through a gate adjacent to the supporters' section, near section 115. Do not enter from the player tunnel at midfield. Photographers should not enter and exit the field from the midfield tunnel.

Photo Bibs: All photographers that are at field level taking photos are required to wear an official Bay FC photo bib. Photographer bibs will be assigned and distributed upon arrival at media will call. Bibs must be returned after the match to the photo work room before departing the stadium.

Photographer Restrooms: Photographers on field level should use the restrooms in the concourse.

Food: Individually packaged food and water will be available. Members of the press on the third level can pick up their food in the press box. All photographers will have food delivered to them in the photo work area tent. Please eat inside the tent or in the press box ONLY. Water is allowed on the sidelines.

MEDIA GUDIDELINES - MATCHDAY

POSTMATCH PRESS CONFERENCES/INTER-VIEWS

Bay FC will hold their press conference in the room just inside the hallway leading into the visiting team locker room area. Once you exit the elevator, walk across the breezeway and through the double doors. The press conference room will be immediately on your right.

Following every match, players and head coaches from BOTH teams will be made available in a press conference format (subject to current NWSL MTF protocols). Home teams must provide in-person access to attending media in addition to Zoom press conferences. Visiting teams are permitted to hold Zoom press conferences but should similarly make every effort to provide access to in-person media.

At least two players will be made available starting approximately 10 minutes after the final game whistle and head coaches will be made available approximately 20 minutes after the final game whistle. Locker rooms will not be open to the media at any point. Both teams will make a reasonable effort to pull additional players upon request.

Team PR directors will highlight players from the match and consider requested names from attending media, or media in the 'NWSLMedia' Slack channel, when deciding on available players.

CREDENTIAL APPLICATIONS

Media members can apply for single-match credentials for the 2024 season by visiting **bayfc.com/** media-credentials.

The club will credential a limited number of nonrights media personnel, subject to the availability of media positions in the press seating areas, photographer and TV areas.

Credentials are for media outlets that need game day press box and/or field access to produce editorial coverage. This includes newspapers, TV, radio and digital websites that produce consistent and professional content as well as photographers on assignment with designated media outlets or wire services.

Applications from freelance writers, photographers or videographers must come from a direct supervisor validating professional and editorial need for media access.

NOTE: Applying for a credential does not guarantee access. Bay FC Communications staff will review all applications and confirmation will be sent out to those who are approved along with additional information no later than 48 hours before each match.
