The 2025 NWSL season will feature a balanced 26-match schedule played over 26 weeks, with each club playing 13 matches at home and 13 matches away. At the mid-way point of the regular season, play will pause for a CBA-mandated break from June 23-29 and during the month of July while confederation competitions (UEFA Women's EURO, Copa America Femenina, etc.) are staged. During this break from the regular season, NWSL clubs will have flexibility to compete in matches against other professional women's teams, including international opponents, ensuring continued competition for all NWSL players. The schedule will avoid staging NWSL matches during FIFA windows to allow the league's top players to compete for both club and country.

Throughout the campaign, Bay FC will celebrate several special occasions, including cultural and heritage theme nights to honor its fans and the diversity of the Bay Area. The club will celebrate its home opener presented by Sutter Health (March 22), Women's Empowerment presented by Invisalign (April 13), Asian American and Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander Night presented by PNC Bank (May 17), Pride (June 7), Juneteenth (June 13), Latino Heritage presented by Visa (Sep. 21), and Fan Appreciation (Oct. 17). Club partner Trader Joes will serve as presenting partner of the Aug. 2 match vs. Houston Dash. Additional details will be announced at a later date.

Bay FC matches will feature on national broadcast platforms several times throughout the season. March 28 will see the club face off with 2024 finalist Washington Spirit at Audi Field on Prime Video, a rematch of last season's quarterfinal. April 13 the club will host the Chicago Stars on ESPN2. Other top national broadcasts on the club's schedule include a Friday night affair June 13 vs. defending champion Orlando Pride at PayPal Park, Aug. 10 vs. Chicago and Aug. 23 vs. Washington on CBS, a Sunday night contest vs. Gotham FC on ESPN2 Sep. 21, and the season's penultimate regular season match vs. North Carolina Courage on Prime Video Oct. 17. The club's remaining matches will be broadcast nationally on ION, CBS Sports Network and NWSL+, the league's domestic direct-to-consumer streaming platform.

The regular season concludes with every team in action Sunday, Nov. 2 as final playoff positions are decided. The postseason is set to begin with the quarterfinal round Nov. 7-9 and continue through the NWSL Championship, presented by Google Pixel, on Nov. 22. As part of the league's expanded playoff format introduced in 2024, eight clubs will qualify for the 2024 NWSL Playoffs.

# THE BAY WAY

On April 4, 2023, the National Women's Soccer League announced it awarded expansion rights for team #14 to an investment group representing the Bay Area, California, which would begin play in 2024.

Just over a year from that announcement, Bay FC kicked off the club's inaugural match, with the first goal coming only 17 minutes into the match and the first win coming 73 minutes later. Surpassing all outside expectations, Bay FC became only the second expansion club in NWSL history to earn a spot in the playoffs.

Co-founded by four U.S. Women's National Team legends—Brandi Chastain, Aly Wagner, Danielle Slaton, and Leslie Osborne—in partnership with global investment firm Sixth Street, Bay FC is changing the face of women's soccer as we know it.

Bay FC is a team that defies convention and transcends culture. We are proud to represent the Bay Area with its tapestry of different ethnicities, languages, climates, and ideas. Our team will be a uniting force, building a culture of belonging and shared pride. We will become a beacon of hope and connection, welcoming and embracing all fans. Our stadium will be a home for people of all backgrounds and identities. We will be the bridge that unites the Bay's diverse communities. Through our actions and our love of the game, we will inspire and improve the lives of others.

While our community is our foundation, our love of football is our reason for being. We have the fire to be the best, and we will show up on the field every day with intensity, competitiveness, passion, and a drive to win.

## THE CREST



Bay FC is represented by a logo steeped in tradition, yet modern and unapologetically athletic: an iconic “B” mark that fuses bridge iconography with classic gothic typography. The logo represents the Bay Area’s unique culture and style, drawing inspiration from the iconic Golden Gate Bridge and the Bay’s impressive street art scene. The bottom and top serifs also nod to the fog that blankets much of the region.

“Bridges define the Bay Area and are symbols of strength that connect us all. Bay FC will unite the region’s tapestry of different cultures, languages and ideas with shared pride and a sense of belonging,” said Danielle Slaton, co-founder of Bay FC. “Our team will be bold and authentic, while humbly serving something greater than ourselves.”

In the team logo, the bold “B” is further brought to life with a refreshing palette of team colors—dark navy blue, warm poppy red and fog gray—a striking combination that stands out and is inspired by the natural beauty of the Bay Area. Both the name and branding offer a strong and classic style with representation of the community it strives to unify. Bay FC co-founders worked closely with renowned San Francisco-based advertising agency Goodby Silverstein & Partners (GS&P) to create the club’s brand and visual identity.

“Street art and street style are central to the soul of the Bay Area and were a big inspiration for this brand,” said Benny Gold, legendary local streetwear designer and design director at GS&P. “We designed a logo that people from all over the Bay, and far beyond, would be proud to wear and represent Bay FC.”

# BOARD MEMBERS

## ALAN WAXMAN (Co-Chair)

Alan Waxman serves on the board of Bay FC and is a co-founding partner and CEO of Sixth Street. Founded in 2009, Sixth Street manages approximately \$65 billion in assets with over 500 team members, including more than 180 investment professionals around the world. 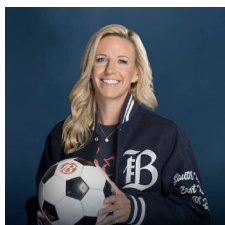
## JENNY WALSH

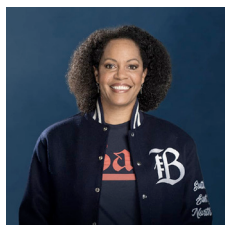

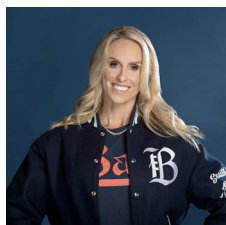

She is chairwoman of the board for the Bay Area Women's Sports Initiative and is a certified Positive Coaching Alliance trainer who travels on behalf of the State Department to coach kids about the life lessons found in soccer. Danielle lives in the Bay Area with her husband and two young sons.



**MATT POTTER**  
SPORTING DIRECTOR

Potter was named Bay FC's Sporting Director in December 2024. He joined the club ahead of its inaugural 2024 season, first serving as technical director before transitioning to Head of Football and Interim Sporting Director during the second half of the campaign.

Potter joined Bay FC after two seasons as Head Coach of the Kansas City Current, where he led the club to the 2022 NWSL title game in his first season. Prior to becoming a coach and executive at the professional level, he was one of the most successful coaches of his era in the college ranks, leading Washington State (2003-11) and Oklahoma's (2011-19) Women's sides from 2003-2019 and reaching the NCAA tournament five times. He has experience as a coach and scout at the game's highest levels, serving the U.S. Women's National Team as an assistant and scout as it claimed the 2019 Women's World Cup title. He was the head coach of the U-23 WNT from 2020-2022, overseeing the development of some of the top young prospects in the federation's player pool.



## ALBERTIN MONTOYA

HEAD COACH

Albertin Montoya was named Bay FC's first head coach on Sept. 27, 2023. Prior to joining Bay FC, he served as the interim head coach for the NWSL's Washington Spirit in 2022. His Bay Area ties run deep, having coached and played in the region throughout his youth, collegiate, and professional career.

Montoya has led some of the most historically successful teams in the women's game. He served as head coach of FC Gold Pride in Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) from 2009 to 2010 – leading the team to the league title in 2010. He served as co-head coach of California Storm from 1999-2006, leading the club to three Women's Premier Soccer League (WPSL) titles and six final appearances in seven seasons. He led the U-17 U.S. Women's National Team to a berth in the 2012 U-17 Women's World Cup, where the squad narrowly missed out on the knockout stage. He was named the 2010 SoccerAmerica Women's Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the 2010 FIFA Women's Coach of the Year honor.

As a player, Montoya represented the U.S. at the 1991 U-17 World Cup in Italy, helping his squad reach the quarterfinals. He played collegiately at Santa Clara University and was a first-round draft selection in the 1998 MLS Draft by the San Jose Clash.

## JASON GOODSON ASSISTANT COACH

Goodson joined Bay FC's staff as an assistant coach ahead of its inaugural 2024 season. He has over two decades of experience on the sidelines, including 12 years as an assistant and recruiting coordinator at Washington State University, Ohio State University and the University of Kentucky. A native of San Jose, Calif., Goodson has served youth players at all levels, including as director of coaching with Reno MVLA Soccer Club (Reno, Nev.), and Ho'okalakupua Futbol Academy (Leahi, Hawai'i). He holds an A license from the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) and a United Soccer Coaches premier diploma.



## ANGELA SALEM ASSISTANT COACH

Salem joined Bay FC's staff as an assistant coach in 2024 after two seasons on the coaching staff with the Washington Spirit. Prior to making the move into the coaching ranks, Salem played professionally for 12 years in the United States, including nine seasons in the NWSL, along with stints in Australia and Finland. She retired following the 2021 season, earning NWSL Best XI honors as a midfielder and was an MVP finalist with Portland Thorns FC. A native of Akron, Ohio, Salem has a USSF B License and a Master of Education in counseling from Springfield College (Mass.) where she was a graduate assistant with the women's soccer program.



## KELLY MILLER GOALKEEPER COACH

Miller serves as Bay FC's goalkeeper coach and joined the club mid-way through the 2024 season. He previously served the Women's program at the University of Kansas for 25 seasons, including 15 as associate head coach under Mark Francis. Miller helped lead the Jayhawks to nine NCAA tournament appearances, KU's first Big 12 soccer title in 2004 as well as the 2019 Big 12 Tournament title. He served as goalkeeper coach of FC Kansas City in the NWSL – one of the league's eight founding clubs – from 2013-2018.

# FACILITIES

## TREASURE ISLAND



San Francisco Mayor London Breed and Bay FC announced September 24 at a joint press conference the plans for the location of Bay FC's new permanent training facility – Treasure Island. The training facility represents the next step in Bay FC's goal of becoming a global sports franchise.

Built and created specifically for women athletes, Bay FC's world-class training facility will be one of a few purpose-built training facilities for women's sports in the United States and home to Bay FC's players, coaches, and football operations staff. The facility will feature three training fields, dedicated sporting operations facilities, and top-of-the-line resources and spaces for players needed to perform at the highest level. Bay FC's facility will be designed to complement the existing and planned youth recreational facilities on the island and further enhance it as a youth sports destination for soccer clinics, additional community activities, and more for the entire Bay Area.

Olson Kundig – an award-winning architectural and interior design firm – has been named the architect of record for the Bay FC Training Facility, the center of the Bay. The world-class training facility offers iconic 360-degree views—from San Francisco's Financial District to the Golden Gate Bridge, North Bay, the Bay Bridge, and East Bay. Bay FC's new home is designed to empower athletes, support staff, and create opportunities for community and youth connections, marking the next step in the team becoming a global sports franchise.

The facility features clear circulation pathways and a balance of private and communal spaces—from three training fields to dedicated recovery areas—ensuring seamless transitions between training, preparation, and downtime for both athletes and staff. Beyond the pitch, the facility will invest in top-of-the-line resources to support athletes' long-term success, including career development, educational resources, and business training.

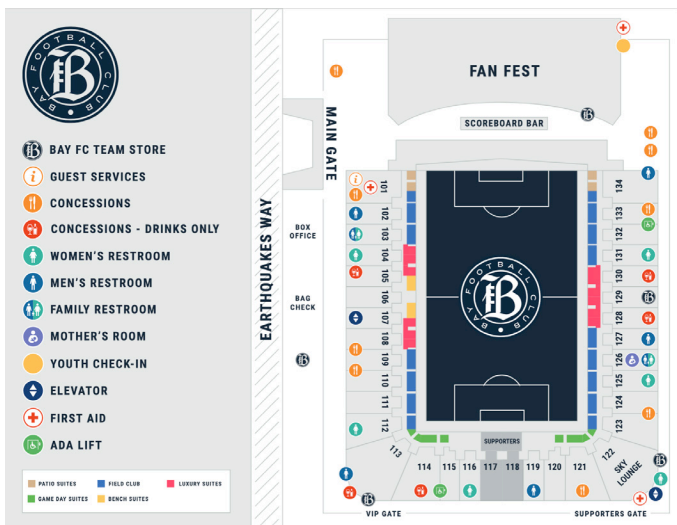
Embracing its position within San Francisco, Bay FC Training Facility will integrate seamlessly into Treasure Island's sports and recreational landscape. In collaboration with the City of San Francisco and the Treasure Island Development Authority (TIDA), the training center's design will complement existing and planned amenities while fostering meaningful public engagement.

## COMMISSIONER



Jessica Berman is the Commissioner of the National Women's Soccer League where she oversees all operations of the league with a focus on supporting players on and off the pitch, working with NWSL clubs to continue to build on the positive momentum of the league's growing audience, and collaborating with NWSL partners to create the most engaging and entertaining fan experience.

Berman joined the NWSL after two and a half years serving as deputy commissioner and executive vice president of business affairs at the National Lacrosse League. During her time with the NLL, Berman's responsibilities included overseeing team services, operations, marketing and communications, broadcast and content, community engagement, human resources, and league governance.

Prior to her time with the NLL, Berman spent 13 years with the National Hockey League, first serving as vice president and deputy general counsel for the organization before becoming vice president of community development, culture and growth and executive director of the NHL Foundation. In her role as Deputy General Counsel, she was involved in collective bargaining negotiations, and was a key contributor in creating and executing the NHL's labor strategy during the 2012 talks.

Berman's later roles with the league focused on bolstering the sports experience for NHL and hockey enthusiasts around the globe. This included implementing a positive, inclusive, community-friendly approach across the league and working to increase access to hockey at all levels of the game. In addition, Berman oversaw the design and execution of the NHL's corporate social responsibility goals and initiatives, an area she is particularly passionate about.

A graduate of the Fordham University School of Law, Berman also worked as an associate at Proskauer Rose LLP in the labor and employment sector where she represented several employers in collective bargaining negotiations, arbitrations, mediations and litigations, and worked on pro bono cases involving domestic violence, sexual assault and military matters.

Berman completed her undergraduate studies at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, Michigan, graduating with a degree in Sports Management and Communications. During her time at Michigan, Berman was involved with the men's hockey and football programs as an assistant in the sports information office. ## MEDIA GUIDELINES

**MEDIA CREDENTIALS**

Media credentials and access will be granted only to individuals with a legitimate working function at a game, training session or event. The bearer must be on a specific assignment. Credentials are non-transferable. Any unauthorized use of a credential subjects the bearer to ejection from the event. Resale or attempted resale is grounds for seizure and cancellation.

The following actions may result in seizure of credential and/or ejection of its wearer from the stadium or training facility:

- Requesting autographs at any time.
- Taking photographs with players/coaches
- Using credential for family or friends of a working media member
- Conduction of unauthorized interviews
- Unprofessional behavior (Cheering in the press box, consumption of alcoholic beverages failure to abide by posted rules, etc.)

**Credential Applications**

Bay FC is accepting applications for Season-Long Credentials and Single-Game Credentials. Members of the media with season-long credentials will be given priority at all Bay FC home matches. Space is limited and media must RSVP to gain access. Media credentials do not guarantee entry into the venue without prior reservation.

All single-game credential requests must be submitted in advance two (2) days prior to the scheduled match. Applications and reservations can be found throughout the season at [bayfc.com/media-kit](http://bayfc.com/media-kit)

Upon arrival at the venue, your name will be confirmed on a list of approved attendees for that particular match. Once your name is confirmed, you will receive a credential that allows you to enter and exit the venue. Your credential access will determine the areas of the venue you will be able to visit.

**Treatment of Credentialed Media**

**Postgame Media Access:** Locker rooms will not be open to media at any point. No individuals other than League or Club representatives shall be allowed in Club locker rooms following a game.

Under no circumstances shall any club and/or its players discriminate in any fashion against an accredited member of the media based upon race, creed, sex or national origin.

**Seating Access:** Accredited media members will have access to the stadium, professional workrooms and stadium seating, if available. During the match, accredited media will have access to the press box which will be restricted to only those accredited media members.

All credentialed media shall be seated in media seating areas, consistent with treatment afforded comparable media. In addition, all members of the media are to be afforded equal treatment and access to facilities and personnel, regardless of sex.

**Traveling Media:** Members of the working media who travel with a visiting team will not be treated in a discriminatory manner with regard to seating or any other privilege or facility accorded to the home media. Comparable seating and equipment should apply to home and road media (print and electronic).

## MEDIA GUIDELINES

**Media Access to Practice:** Bay FC will work to provide media access to practice whenever possible. If practices are closed, Bay FC will grant a 15-minute media access period at the start or end of practice at least once per week. In addition, Bay FC will make a member of the coaching staff and/or a player available for interviews at least once per week.

**Game Day Guidelines for Photographers and Camera Operators:** All photographers and television camera operators must stay behind the field boards at all times, unless released by the on-site photo marshal.

Each photographer will be permitted to use one monopod – but no tripods.

Stand-alone remote units on or around the goal posts will not be permitted without permission from the Home Team, the NWSL and the Referees.

**Photographer Access to field:** Photographers shall be permitted behind the field boards in designated areas at Children's Mercy Park. Photographers must not be blocking viewing of fans or spectators in any capacity.

Once situated, no movement shall be permitted until halftime. Changes in this policy will be allowed in cases where stadium facilities dictate alterations. No photographers shall be allowed near the team benches.

**Game Day Photographer Identification:** In addition to their regular credential photographers will be issued colored bibs. Photographers will pick up their bib when they check-in at the stadium and return as they leave.

**Game Day Photography Work Area:** A work area will be provided for photographers, near the field where appropriate, with high-speed internet access.

### **NON-RIGHTS HOLDER VIDEO GUIDELINES**

#### **Video Footage:**

All rights to match footage including all applicable copyrights belong to the National Women's Soccer League and its rights holders who broadcast each specific match.

#### **Television Broadcasters:**

**Game Action:** Television broadcasters can use footage of NWSL events obtained either via 1) their own recording or 2) action dubbed from a NWSL rights holder broadcast with credit only in connection with its regularly scheduled news programming within a week of the game. This footage should not exceed two (2) minutes. Highlights aired as part of a continuous news program should not be longer than one (1) minute per 30-minute segment. Credits: NWSL / Kansas City.

**Filming – Game Action:** FOR TELEVISED EVENTS, NON-RIGHTS HOLDERS / ENG CAMERAS MAY RECORD THE FIRST 10 MINUTES OF EACH match. For non-televised events, non-rights holders / ENG cameras may record the entire game but are still subject to the aforementioned limits. This includes events that are web streamed live online.

**Filming – Interviews and Scene Sets:** There is no limit to the gathering of footage pre-game, at halftime and post-game. All footage gathered is subject to the usage guidelines indicated in this document

# NWSL

## MEDIA GUIDELINES

**Filming – In Seating Area:** Video cameras looking to shoot in the concourse or seating area must contact home team and NWSL in advance of the event for approval.

**Previews or Advances:** In advance of a NWSL event, television broadcasters can use two (2) minutes of archival game action to preview an upcoming event. In the local/regional markets, broadcasters should mention the time and location of the game along with their report. Outside of the local markets, broadcasters should mention the time and broadcast information.

**Television Broadcasters’ Web Sites:** Video produced for air as part of regular programming that is simulcast or archived online must be accompanied by a link to NWSLSoccer.com. Content produced exclusively for the Internet is subject to the guidelines for Online Video.

### Online Video

**Game Action:** Online organizations (including print publications that post video online) are not permitted to film or use game action video without prior written approval by NWSL. Game action includes any footage of the field, teams, etc., following the beginning of the television broadcast window. Only video of off-field activities (i.e. interviews, training sessions) may be recorded.

**Non-Game Video:** Any video posted online that is recorded as part of media access is limited to the use of eight (8) minutes per day/activity date. Online video may not incorporate integrated advertising and must be accompanied by links to NWSLSoccer.com.

**Professional Presentation:** Online video is expected to be recorded, edited and presented in a professional manner. Video must be presented/hosted on an organization’s website, and not solely on a site provided by a third-party (i.e. YouTube, Vimeo, Facebook, etc.).

**Online Video Sites:** Organizations who regularly post video to online video sites (i.e. YouTube, Vimeo, etc.) may not include advertising with video gathered as a result of media access. Allowing users to embed these videos is not permitted, and the description of any video must include a link to NWSLSoccer.com.
