TEAM HISTORY

The Washington, D.C. area was selected as one of eight markets that would field a team to participate in the NWSL's inaugural season in 2013. In December 2012, the team's name was announced as the Washington Spirit.

Since its start in the NWSL, the Spirit has participated in all eleven seasons of the league thus far, with its best result coming in 2021 when Washington defeated the Chicago Red Stars to win its first-ever NWSL Championship.

The Spirit began playing select games at Audi Field in Washington, D.C. during the 2018 season and set a still-standing attendance record on August 24, 2019 when the club hosted 19,871 fans in a 2-1 win over the Orlando Pride.

After joining the club as a minority investor in 2021, health information technology visionary Michele Kang became the majority owner of the Spirit before the 2022 season. Under Kang, the Spirit has seen remarkable growth as a professional club.

During the 2022 season, Kang brought in one of college soccer's most successful head coaches in Mark Krikorian.






TEAM HISTORY

The three-time national championship-winning coach was named the club's President of Soccer Operations/General Manager. Prior to the 2023 season, newly-hired VP of Performance, Medical and Innovation built out the most robust staff of athletic support staff in the history of the NWSL. The same year, the Spirit began playing all home matches at Audi Field in DC as part of Kang's vision to build a 'premier, professional and proudly DC' women's soccer team.

This season, the Spirit welcomes two new coaches. Renowned Spanish coach Jonatan Giráldez was announced as the club's next Head Coach in January 2024 and will officially join the team this summer upon the conclusion of his current club's season. In the interim, fellow Spaniard Adrián González has been brought in to lead the Spirit and will remain on Giráldez's staff once he arrives.

The Spirit will kick off its 2024 campaign on the road against Seattle Reign FC on Sunday, March 17 before returning to DC for its home opener at Audi Field against expansion side Bay FC on Saturday, March 23.

AUDI FIELD

Audi Field is a state-of-the-art soccer-specific venue that is home to the NWSL's Washington Spirit, MLS' D.C. United and the UFL's D.C. Defenders. Located near Nationals Park in Washington, D.C.'s Buzzard Point, the stadium officially opened its doors on July 14, 2018.

In 2018, the Spirit coordinated with D.C. United to start playing select home matches at Audi Field. The Spirit played its first-ever game at the venue on August 25, 2018. A year later, on August 24, 2019, the team hosted a club record 19,871 fans. In 2023, the club's first season as a full-time tenant of Audi Field, the Spirit averaged nearly 11,000 fans per home contest. Capacity at each of the club's previous two home stadiums was just 5,000.

After hosting seven games at Audi Field in 2021 and another nine in 2022, the Spirit played all 14 home fixtures of 2023 at the Buzzard Point venue and will play its second full home schedule at the stadium in 2024. Washington enters 2024 with an overall record of 17 wins, seven losses and 11 draws at Audi Field.



NEW KITS

The Washington Spirit unveiled two groundbreaking new kits designed by Nike ahead of the 2024 season. The kits, known as the Blackout and the Spotlight, represent the club's journey under majority owner Michele Kang's visionary leadership. Kang has been vocal in her mission to grow the Washington Spirit into the world's preeminent sports organization, and innovation has been a central theme from the club's current branding journey to the investment in fem tech to train females as females and recruiting one of the world's best head coaches.

The Blackout kit is inspired by the columns and architecture found throughout the region. The convergence of patterns on the tonal grey and black graphic is reflective of bridging the communities within DC, Maryland and Virginia. This uniform will be the Spirit's primary set, being worn predominantly at home in 2024 and inspiring fans to Blackout Audi with sellout attendances throughout the season.

NEW KITS



Perhaps most notably this season, the club introduces a vibrant yellow as one of its main colors. Featured on the Spotlight kit, yellow is a nod to the club's trailblazing spirit and a hint of the club's forthcoming new brand positioning in 2025. As Washington's secondary kit, the Spotlight set will be worn predominantly on the road in 2024.

The Washington Spirit began a new era under the leadership of Kang. The organization is in the midst of a full rebrand set to debut in 2025. This journey began last season when the club pivoted with a simplified look to black, white and chrome. This season's refresh includes the addition of yellow giving a nod at what's to come next season.



MAJORITY OWNER

MICHELE KANG

Michele Kang is an American businesswoman, investor, and philanthropist.

Born and raised in South Korea, Kang came to the United States as a student to pursue her American dream. She has spent her career building businesses that challenge the status quo—and leveraging her own successes, she has focused on helping others achieve their own American dreams.

Kang is the founder and CEO of Cognosante. A visionary in the field of health information technology, Michele founded Cognosante in 2008 to disrupt and challenge the status quo in the U.S. healthcare system. Under Michele's leadership, Cognosante has grown rapidly, and emerged as a trusted provider of innovative health and safety solutions for key Federal health, military, and intelligence agencies as well as state health and social services agencies.

In 2020, Kang laid the groundwork for women's ownership of major sports franchises by becoming the first female co-owner of a National Women's



Upon taking over the Spirit in 2022, Kang has worked to make her vision of building not only the best women's soccer team but the best team in the world. Kang made immediate investments in the team, hiring four-time NCAA champion coach Mark Krikorian as the team's General Manager and NWSL Champion head coach Mark Parsons. Her investments included developing a sports performance staff, led by Dawn Scott — a first in the

NWSL. Additionally, Kang helped negotiate a deal to secure Audi Field as the Spirit's permanent venue for home

matches.

On May 16, 2023, Kang announced the creation of a multi-club organization that will bring together the Spirit and the French club Olympique Lyonnais, an eight-time Champions League winner, as the first teams in a network of women's soccer clubs stretching around the globe. It is the first woman-owned, women-led multi-club organization of its kind.



MAJORITY OWNER

Michele demonstrates a commitment to equity, inclusion, and opportunity for all — something that is reflected in Cognosante's and the Spirit's culture and the philanthropic initiatives she established. In 2021, Michele launched Cognosante's HBCU Partner Alliance, a new program built through a targeted collaboration with Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). The HBCU Partner Alliance prepares students of color for promising careers in IT and government contracting. Her efforts promote economic sustainability through entrepreneurship and focus on increasing opportunities for Veterans, under- resourced young adults, and persons with disabilities. With a mission to promote the dignity of work, the Cognosante Foundation, established in 2012, focuses on supporting members from underserved communities as they pursue financial independence through meaningful careers.

In recognition of her entrepreneurial success and philanthropic efforts, she has received numerous accolades including the Palm Beach Atlantic University 2019 American Free Enterprise Medal, the 2015 EY Entrepreneur of The Year® for the Washington, DC region, and the U.S. Award for Services. She was elected along with U.S. senators, high-ranking government officials, and top executives of Fortune 500 companies as an inaugural member of 100 Women Leaders in STEM in 2012 and one of the "Top 100 CEO Leaders in STEM" in 2016.

Michele is also an active supporter of the arts and technology; she is a Trustee on the Boards of the Washington National Opera and the Norton Museum of Art, and the Northern Virginia Technology Council. Michele earned a bachelor's degree in economics from The University of Chicago and a master's degree in public and private management from Yale School of Management

GIRALDEZ HEAD COACH Jonatan (Jona) Giráldez Costas was named the Washington Spirit's next Head Coach in January 2024. Giráldez is currently the Head Coach of FC Barcelona Feminí in Spain's Liga F, the country's top-tier women's league, and will officially join the Spirit upon the conclusion of the 2023-24 Spanish season.

Giráldez began his tenure at FC Barcelona in 2019 as an assistant before being promoted to be the club's Head Coach in 2021 after just two seasons. In the less than three years since his promotion, Giráldez has led Barcelona to a long list of accolades. Winning Liga F in each of his first two seasons, Barcelona also won the 2021-22 Copa de la Reina and 2022-23 UEFA Women's Champions League. Additionally, Giráldez led Barcelona to 58 consecutive Liga F wins to start his head coaching tenure, including a perfect 30-0-0 record in his first season at the helm.

For his stellar coaching, Giráldez was named the IFFHS World's Best Club Coach in 2023. He was also named a finalist for the UEFA Women's Coach of the Year Award in 2023 and FIFA's The Best Women's Coach award in early 2024. Giráldez is originally from Vigo in the Galicia community of northwest Spain. He and his partner Olaya welcomed their first child, a son, in 2023.



GONZÁLEZ

Interim Head Coach

Adrián González was named as part of Jonatan Giráldez's coaching staff in January 2024, also being tapped as the club's Interim Head Coach to lead the Spirit until Giráldez's arrival.

González brings an impressive 20-plus-year international coaching career with him to DC. Most recently, González served as the Head Coach at RCD Espanyol in Spain's Primera Federación, the country's second-tier professional women's league. Prior to his time with the women's first team, he coached various men's youth teams at Espanyol and coached in both Japan, with Ventforet Kofu, and Greece, with Xanthi FC.

In addition to his impressive coaching credentials, González brings extensive academic training to the Spirit. González has always been involved with several academic institutions as a professor or instructor for classes related to training and football methodology (clubs, soccer federations and universities). He holds a degree in Sport Science by INEF Lleida, two master's degrees in Sport Management and Financial Intelligence and a UEFA A license. The last five years he has concentrated on gaining knowledge and experiences in the mental and emotional optimization of athletes.

González is originally from Barcelona in Spain.

MORINAO IMAIZUMI

Player Development Coach Serving as an assistant coach at Florida State under Spirit General Manager and President of Sporting Operations, Mark Krikorian, for 13 seasons, Mike Bristol joined the Spirit in August 2022.

Bristol is a defensive specialist. During his time at Florida State, Bristol oversaw a defending third that averaged over 14 shutouts per season and held a goals against average (GAA) of 0.69 while helping FSU to three national championships during his tenure.

Prior to his move to Tallahassee, Bristol served as an assistant coach at the University of Maryland and Illinois State University. Additionally, Bristol was a four-year starter in goal for the Western Illinois University Leathernecks from 1995 through 1998, serving as a team captain for three seasons.

In 2014, Bristol was named the NCSAA Assistant Coach of the Year.

Morinao "Ima" Imaizumi joined the Washington Spirit staff in November 2022 after a stint as an assistant coach with the Chicago Red Stars. Ima comes to the Spirit with several decades of experience as a coach.

Hailed as one of the best player development coaches in the business, Imaizumi was previously the youth development head coach at the Japan Football Association (JFA), later becoming the assistant director of coaching education at the JFA.

He has served as the head coach of multiple Japanese youth national teams and as an assistant coach for the senior team. During the Summer Olympics in Tokyo, Imaizumi served as an assistant for the senior team that advanced to the quarterfinal. Ima also as a coach on Mark Krikorian's Florida State staff for nearly decade, beginning in 2011.

Assistant Coach / Player Development Coach

Despite being the newest member of the Washington Spirit's coaching staff, Mami Yamaguchi brings a wealth of technical experience to the Washington Spirit.

Yamaguchi played professionally for nearly two decades – starting her professional playing career as a teenager – before beginning her career as a coach, most recently serving as an assistant coach with Detroit City FC.

Her playing career was immensely decorated, representing the Japan Women for several years, scoring eight goals in that time. She played professionally across top-tier leagues in Japan, the United States and Sweden, appearing in over 130 club matches

However, she also played under current Spirit General Manager and President of Sporting, Mark Krikorian, when she attended Florida State University from 2005 to 2007. She played three seasons with the Seminoles, winning college soccer's most prestigious award, the MAC Hermann Trophy, in 2007.

In her first season playing with the Swedish side Umeå IK, Yamaguchi played in the Champions League Final, along with teammate Marta, against 1. FFC Frankfurt.



Started all 20 matches in which she appeared, playing 1,799 minutes in goal. Secured four clean sheets and had a save success rate of 75.9% and a goals against average (GAA) of 1.20. Made her 100th regular season appearance in the season opener on March 26. Became the sixth goalkeeper in NWSL history to achieve each of the following milestones: 10,000 career regular season minutes, 400 career regular season saves and 30 regular season clean sheets.

2022

Started all 19 matches in which she appeared in goal, playing 1,710 minutes. Secured three clean sheets and had a save success rate of 68.9% and a goals against average (GAA) of 1.58..

2021

Started all 25 matches, playing a total of 2,310 minutes. Secured nine clean sheets, 80 saves and had a save success rate of 78.4% and a GAA of 0.86. Named to the NWSL Team of the Month in October and earned the 2021 NWSL Goalkeeper of the Year award for the second time. Part of the 2021 NWSL Championship team, named 2021 NWSL Championship Game MVP.

2020

Started all nine Challenge Cup and Fall Series matches, playing a total of 810 minutes. Secured three clean sheets, 20 saves and had a save success rate of 66.7% and a GAA of 0.8 in the Challenge Cup. In the Fall Series, had a save success rate of 75% and a GAA of 1.0.

Called-up to the U.S. Women's National Team (USWNT) for the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup, her first-ever World Cup roster

Capped for the USWNT for the first time. Started in her first appearance, recording a clean sheet.

2019

Started all 24 matches, playing a total of 2,149 minutes. Secured nine clean sheets, 86 saves, and had a save success rate of saves of 77.5% and a GAA of 1.05. Named to the NWSL Team of the Month in the months of May, June and August, and was named the 2019 NWSL Goalkeeper of the Year.

2018

Traded to the Washington Spirit before the season began. Finished her first season as a member of the Spirit with an NWSL regular season record 108 saves. Tallied four clean sheets on the season and made a career-high ten saves in her Spirit debut in the club's regular season opener on March 24 against Seattle Reign FC. Won back-to-back NWSL Save of the Week awards in Weeks 5 and 6 and was named the NWSL Player of the Week for Weeks 11 and 12.

2017 (ORLANDO PRIDE)

Started 11 games for Orlando during the regular season, earning two clean sheets and racking up 36 saves. Earned a pair of NWSL Save of the Week honors, in Week 9 and Week 12. Joined Australian side Sydney FC on loan during the NWSL's 2017-2018 offseason to compete in the Westfield W-League.

2016 (ORLANDO PRIDE)

Selected by the Orlando Pride in the 2016 NWSL Expansion Draft and appeared in one game during the 2016 NWSL season.

2015 (SKY BLUE FC)

Played in one game for Sky Blue FC (now NJ/NY Gotham FC) before joining Danish club Fortuna Hjørring on Ioan. Signed with Sky Blue FC as a discovery player.

WAKE FOREST UNIVERSITY

Finished a storied career as a four-year starter at Wake Forest from 2010-13 earning All-America honors for three consecutive years. Earned First Team All-ACC honors her senior year, the third consecutive year earning All-ACC honors and her second time earning First Team honors.
